PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 2010/11 season effectively started 6 months earlier than usual when an interest group of current and past players joined forces with the approval of the General Committee to plan the club's 'On Field' revival. Unfortunately the 'on field' performance of our club over the last few seasons saw us potentially heading for relegation to 2nd Division.

One significant initial outcome from this group was to decide to create a new position 'Director of Cricket' and identify that ideally we needed to recruit Don Royce for that job. The next significant outcome was to decide that we needed to recruit an outstanding non-playing Coach, and to identify that ideally that person was to be Bryan Thomas. To the credit of all concerned these plans were carried out successfully and both agreed to be part of the Newtown & Chilwell revival story. Out of the cricket wilderness past player Mick Wood appeared to volunteer his coaching skills, and these were quickly accepted. The club now had three exceptional people running the 'on field' side of the club.

The next significant outcome from this group was to identify potential recruits, particularly potential Turf players. With Don and Bryan's knowledge of every good young player in Geelong over the last few years, coupled with an emphasis on us approaching 'lost' former Newtown players the campaign was established. Added to this was the revival of our club's relationship with Essex as we requested a player from them. The outcome of this exercise resulted in 11 new turf players representing the club in Round 1 against Lara – 6 in the 1sts and 5 in the 2nds. A credit to all those involved with the pre-season recruiting.

With a stronger player list the 1sts were able to win 2 games and the seconds played in the finals, only to be unluckily washed out of a game that they were well placed to win. There is no doubt that the very wet summer affected our performance in the 1sts, as we were in a strong position on several occasions only to be washed out. However the stronger playing list up top in turn strengthened our lower sides, and all were fortunate to make the finals.

Only the 5ths and 7ths made the Grand Final but neither was able to win a flag. It should be recognized however that we moved from a situation during the previous season of struggling to fill 6 teams to being easily able to fill 7 teams for the first time in the history of the club.

There was even one round when most players were available and we could have picked 8 teams. A group of our juniors who attended Geelong College were an important part of the extra players that we had prior to the Christmas break. We are looking forward to seeing this group in particular develop over the next few years. I believe it quite possible that the Premiership that they won at College this season can be emulated at Newtown & Chilwell in the near future. The key outcome of this improved performance was to lift us up the ratings from a precarious bottom to a safer middle level, and effectively remove the threat of relegation in the near future. We cannot rest however and must continue to recruit and improve to feel entirely safe in this regard.

Other issues that I would like to comment on include the following:

Centenary celebrations. Being our club's Centenary year added an extra pressure to many of our members trying firstly to cope with the relegation threat. We were able to form a special group of current and past players to plan how to celebrate this occasion. The outcome was a Dinner at the Pier in Geelong on February 26 attended by over 290 people. The highlights of this evening were the attendance of many past players, the naming of the Centenary Team of players and administrators, the speeches given by life members Bob Merriman and Greg Wells and the large number of female attendees who commented on how much they loved the evening. Unfortunately some activities planned for Sunday's celebrations were rained out.

Sponsorships. Thank you to all those people and businesses that supported us during the season. Phillip Morgan and Brett Bentley were primarily responsible for dramatically increasing the level of sponsorships from the previous season. We need to broaden the base of helpers in the coming season as this area needs to be improved again to cover the extra financial commitments to the new Practice wickets and the non-playing Coaching staff.

Our Club's Financial Position. It is a credit to past Club Administrators that the club was in the fortunate position to be able to fund the new Practice wickets, and the additional non-playing Coaching Staff. We must continue to be particularly vigilant in this regard so that we are able to complete the Practice Wickets area and continue to fulfill these ongoing commitments.

The Practice Wickets. The club is now in the fortunate position of having outstanding practice facilities. A real thank you to all players for enduring the difficulties in the transition from the top oval to the bottom oval. A thank you also to all those members and parents who helped lay the rolls of instant turf. It was a heart-warming sight to see 40 odd people turn a seemingly endless task into a one hour job. We would not have these facilities were it not for the outstanding contribution of Scott Mullen and the assistance of curator Graeme Taylor. Unfortunately Scott will not be able to complete the job due to work commitments; however he will assist David Murray and Graeme Taylor to the end.

The Curator. Graeme Taylor continues to provide outstanding match day pitches on Stinton Oval, and this has finally been recognized by the GCA who is now scheduling more finals matches at Queens Park. Graeme's passion for producing great pitches will include the practice wickets this season as the new complex offers a new and exciting challenge for him. We are indeed fortunate to have a curator of Graeme's calibre at our club.

The Major Raffle. This continues to be our main fund raiser. It is amazing that it continues to be so successful even when this season members were given a much shorter time to sell their tickets. Thanks in particular to Graeme Chisholm, Tony Devlin and Stephanie Shaw for their contribution towards the success of this activity.

Juniors. The role of Junior Coordinator is one of the most challenging and significant tasks in our club. This year's coordinator, Tony Jefferies continued the high standards set by his predecessor Mark Turnley. It was good to see some senior players helping Tony to coach on Fridays and Saturdays. He will want this to continue this season. Tony will also need more support off the ground, mainly in the 'My Cricket' area. Our thanks to Tony for his outstanding contribution.

Over 60's. At the other end of the playing spectrum we have some older players – the Geelong Over 60's - using our practice wickets and the Stinton Oval wicket on many Sunday's during the year. This is set to increase as they may have 2 teams next season. All these players pay a membership fee to our club. We are pleased to be able to assist this group and look forward to continuing our arrangement with them next season.

The Clark Cup. Although the Jason Clark Foundation Group is a separate entity from our club it is primarily supported by our club members, and the two entities are forever interwoven. It is a wonderful thing that such a contribution is being made towards a better understanding of the illness 'depression' out of such a tragedy. The club is proud to be associated with this activity and congratulate in particular club members Andrew Green and Nathan Clark for their significant contributions towards the success of this day.

The General Committee. All members should be aware of the many hours that Committee members work on their behalf to make their experience at this club a better one. Colin Cunliffe ensures that all players pay a membership. Max Ellis and Mark Turnley are the key 'floaters' who fill a vacancy when it appears. Max also acted as Chairman of Selectors.

Stephanie Shaw has been Secretary for the last two years and represented the club on the GCA Management Committee as the Statistician, as well as acting as a Scorer for our club. She is moving on to the Geelong CC to further her career and we wish her well. Scott Mullen produces financial reports that many companies would be proud of. He is also stepping down from the Committee at the end of this year. Scott has been a magnificent worker for the club for many years.

Don Royce has had the job of reporting on behalf of the Coaches and Captains. His mere presence at Committee level adds an important quality to the running of our club. Brett Loats organized our Social Calendar. Unfortunately the excessively wet season restricted his efforts on some occasions. Brett has indicated that he may also be stepping down this season, but if he does so he will help the new people, so we need some new young blood to take over from him. James Purcell had the Rooms and Bar portfolio. Kevin Simonsen is the quietly supportive 'parent' on our Committee, who is looking to assist with coordinating a volunteer system to work the bar next season.

Warwick Hadfield was lost to us for most of the year due to his new job but he helped when he could and remained a significant supporter whenever needed. Phillip Morgan excelled in his contribution to our club and was fittingly awarded the Jim Perry Trophy for the Most Valuable Playing Club Member. Besides sponsorships Phillip was the 5th Captain, the 'My Cricket' Statistician, assistant Chairman of Selectors, and a participant in most other jobs going around at any time. We have some big shoes to fill next season, and hopefully this will give some younger members the opportunity to step up and participate in the running of this club.

The Captains. Our club has been blessed for many years to have quality captains and this season was no exception. Ben Neville was the captain of our captains and accordingly led from the front. The passion of Ben and Russell Mitchell in the 2nds is a considerable factor before they even display their talents. There is much more to captaincy than on Saturday. All captains assist in running practice, participate in club selection, and must plan meticulously to organize their team to play. A big thank you to all captains for their contributions this season.

The **Geelong Amateur Football Club** is our co-tenant at Queens Park. It is important to both clubs that we have a sound working relationship, as some benefits are best achieved as a joint rather than an individual venture. I am pleased to announce that a good relationship has now been established and we look forward to working together again with our co-tenant in the future.

The Healthy Sporting Environment Project. To further assist our Club in its endeavors to be the best that we can be both on and off the field, we have enrolled in a VicHealth, Healthy Sporting Environment Project that will run from 2011 until March 2013. This project is funded by VicHealth and is designed to assist us in becoming a better sporting club in a number of important areas of operation. You will hear more about this from Don Royce next season.

The Kitchen. We are indeed fortunate that Clare Hamilton was referred to Antoinette Mullen as a possible club caterer and custodian of our kitchen. Since her appointment she has endeared herself to all club members with the quality of her food as well as her pleasant personality. Clare is a dedicated supplier of fresh and healthy food, and her menu will be a positive for our foray into the world of the healthy sporting environment.

The Tribune. This publication has been an enduring feature of our Club over the past 30 odd seasons recording the Club's history and keeping all members informed of our valued sponsors and upcoming events. Thanks to David Barnes for maintaining this outstanding publication and all those that contribute articles for it. David also is responsible for all other club publications and historians will be forever in awe of the work that he does to record all statistics.

The Bar potentially provides extra revenue for our club. Unfortunately the need to employ staff erodes much of the profit. Next season we will be endeavouring to roster volunteer staff to run the bar. Volunteers may only be needed one evening per month. This will occur with no disrespect to the excellent staff that were employed in the past. The club will pay for members to complete the Responsible Serving of Alcohol course. Could volunteers please make themselves known to us.

Another outcome from the interest group that started the 'On Field' revival was that it expected to take 3 years to get the club back on track to seriously challenge for the Club Championship. One of these years has now gone and I am firmly of the opinion that we are certainly on track to achieve the three year vision. I trust that all members and supporters are approaching next season with the same anticipation and endeavor as last season.

COACH'S REPORT

Leadership

Success starts with leadership and the Club was fortunate to be able to generally reappoint captains from the previous season in a vote of confidence and at the same time ensuring stability and sound on field leadership.

As we move forward we will need to identify and nurture potential captains at the various levels within the Club. With Mark Turnley relinquishing the 6th captaincy it was good to have Brett Bentley available to take the reins and when the 7th X1 was formed Neville Crane was appointed to not only captain that X1 but also to ensure that there were 11 players available to represent the Club each week.

The Club is indebted to Ben Neville, Russell Mitchell, Frank Tuskes, Grant Whitehead, Phillip Morgan, Brett and Neville for not only accepting these positions but also for the manner in which they carried out their responsibilities.

The Chairman of Selectors was again Max Ellis with the Director of Cricket Don Royce occasionally called on to fill in for Max. Selection meetings were held on Tuesday evenings and they were often full of robust and free exchanges of opinion. Managing the availability of well over 100 players takes a fair bit of management so it was great that we were able to fill the seven teams every week and to be as competitive as we were.

The Pre Season Program commenced on Friday evenings and Sunday afternoons in August at the Geelong Indoor Sports Arena with high levels of attendance and energy that gave us a great deal of reassurance. The players responded positively the program and were eager for action when we eventually ventured outdoors at either Queens Park or the Geelong College Prep school. We are indebted to the Geelong College for assisting us during September when rain left us without adequate practice facilities.

The contribution of Club Secretary Stephanie Shaw during the pre season in recording attendance and coordinating batting groups was greatly appreciated and the outstanding attendance of Sam & Ben Eason at pre season sessions deserves a mention. Club Treasurer and veteran opening bowler Scott Mullen was also a standard setter at the pre season sessions.

Our players deserve big congratulations for responding to the serious possibility of relegation, by attending pre season sessions in large numbers and for preparing as professionally as they did for what was to be a crucial season.

Facilities & Curator.

It would be remiss of me to not mention the dedication and professional approach of our curator Graeme Taylor. His excellent wickets are the result of many hours of solitary and

caring work. The GCA used the Stinton Oval centre wicket for a 1st X1 semi final & a 2nd X1 preliminary final reminding us of the high quality wickets GT presented each weekend.

Our players should at all times appreciate the work he does. As well they should also value the excellent playing and practice facilities they now have as well as the magnificent clubrooms.

We can all look forward to the starting next season on the new practice wickets. With players in all grades training in the one location next season there will be opportunities for a range of new activities, rules of operations and player interaction.

Recruits

In a season where the on field performance of our players was the most critical factor in determining the Club's immediate future, the recruitment of players to improve our stocks at the top end was essential.

At the end of the season we can say that recruits Bennett Merriman, Tim Nunn, Peter Lynch, Riley Ferguson, Alex Hickey, Levi Dare, Jack Wood, Nigel Jenkins and Sam Arthurton (from the Essex County Cricket Academy), not only strengthened our player pool and contributed to some much needed success at the turf level, but they also enabled a number of emerging young players to perform successfully at lower levels within the Club.

While Dale Denny played 3 games with the Club in 2009-10 he could almost be included as a recruit. Dale made his 1st X1 debut this season and performed very well in the 2nd X1 as an allrounder.

Tony Connell fell into the same category demonstrating that it is possible to resurrect a playing career when he also made his 1st X1 debut in round 5 against Grovedale CC at the age of 43 and 195 days, having previously played a season at NCCC in the lower grades after a long layoff. Tony is now the oldest player to debut in our Club's 1st X1.

While the return of Shannon Gove resulted in only a few games it was good for the Club to have him play those games and hopefully Shannan will be available to add to his career at the NCCC in the coming season. His 4 wickets against the strong Grovedale batting line up in the 1st X1, T/20 match was an indication of what could be if he was fit and able to string some games together.

A notable recruit this season was Darryn Lyons (Mr Paparazzi) who managed to fit in some games with the 5th X1 and remind us that despite his busy, international lifestyle he was a handy wicket taking bowler and an enthusiastic team member.

Other notable debutants included Kane Grambeau who took 5/10 against North Shore CC in the 7th X1 in his first game and keeper Dave Anderson who took 6 catches and completed a run out in the 3rd X1 match against Leopold in round 9 after suffering a serious head injury earlier in the season.

The Season

Maybe the regular interruption to play in the month of October was a huge frustration for all of us who had put in a big pre season and were ready to give it our best.

Of the 12 rounds of one & two day matches scheduled on turf, regular and quite heavy falls of rain resulted in 3 of the first 5 rounds being rain delayed and unfinished, with round 10 at the start of February also being washed out. Between a quarter and a third of all 1st & 2nd X1 matches were not able to be completed due to rainfall and saturated wickets. The suggestion by some clubs to play more one day games after the Christmas break to reduce the “luck of the draw” with the matter of promotion & relegation was not agreed to by the GCA.

It was rainfall that resulted in our 2nd X1 failing to “get on” the Lara wicket at 3/86 on day 2 of the semi final to chase down East Belmont’s 185. The drawn result was another disappointing case of “what might have been” and a reminder that where you finish on the ladder is important when you play finals.

While we didn’t manage to win a senior premiership we did avoid relegation and all but one of our 7 teams played finals with 3rds - 7ths playing semi finals and the 5ths & 7ths competing in grand finals.

It was also a special celebration when the Club won all 7 matches on the final day of the home and away season.

While these figures display improved on field success, they clearly indicate that our Club is much stronger in the lower grades so there is still improvement required in our turf teams if we are to be regarded as one of the GCA’s more powerful clubs. That 30% of our turf matches were won this season is an improvement on the one 2nd X1 victory last season, so we are heading in the right direction.

Twenty/20 Program

Thirty-four GCA clubs participated in round 1 with NCCC defeating the highly fancied Grovedale CC in a bowl off, following a tie. In round 2 we restricted Waurm Ponds to 4/100 on the Stinton Oval wicket as they chased our 6/136. In the next round against Alexander Thomson our 3/145 proved more than enough and in the elimination final we

defeated Lara by 35 runs. Then we took only 16 overs and the loss of 2 wickets to pass the Guild/ St Mary's total to earn a spot in the last 4, the preliminary final round.

Unfortunately we were soundly defeated by the South Barwon batting line up in the penultimate round, but the five preceding performances surely gave our players (including some from lower X1's), reason to believe that they were competitive in Division one competitions. The T/20 program gave us the opportunity to play and "blood" some of our emerging players against some of the best in the GCA.

Individual Player Highlights:

Although a lot of playing time was lost due to inclement weather, there were many memorable performances by NCCC players during the season and I will mention the following;

- Centuries scored by Ben Neville and Bennett Merriman in the 1st 1X, Riley Ferguson (2) and Pat Eastman in the 2nd X1 and Jai Sheehan (160*) in the 5th X1 gave us all reasons to celebrate.

It is hoped that our players will score more centuries than were scored this season.

- Five Wicket hauls were achieved by Peter Lynch in the 1st X1, Alex Hickey, Dale Denny & Dev Royce in the 2nd X1, Ben Eason (8/40) & Sam Eason in the 3rd X1, Paul Shakespeare in the 3rd X1, Brett Bentley in the 6th X1 and David Kirkland, Kane Grambeau (5/10) and Anthony Sirgiannis in the 7th X1.
- Brett Bentley snagged a hat trick against Anakie in round 13.
Better fielding skills in all grades will help our bowlers to improve their strike rates and bowling averages.
- George Cameron's 94* in the 5th X1 v Grovedale to contribute 70% of the NCCC total.
- A match winning partnership of 162 by Bennett Merriman (109*) & Tim Nunn (87) against Lara in round 12 was just reward for these two players who agreed to assist the Club in its time of need.
- The significant improvement and valuable contributions with the bat, shown by Ben Neville, Cory Mathieson and Yves Roussety.
- The emergence of Brett Loats as an economical wicket taking leg spinner on turf wickets. (11 wkts in 5 matches @ 13.7)
- The defiance & discipline of Riley Ferguson (153) and Dale Denny (51) during their memorable, match winning 128 run partnership that began when we were 5/22 against the Lara 2nd X1.
- The 131 run partnership by Pat Eastman 119 & Riley Ferguson (105) v GWCC 2nd X1 that was an indication of the youthful batting talent in our 2nd X1.
- A 111 run partnership by Sam Arthurton & Ben Neville v St Josephs 1st X1 that gave us a chance to defeat a more highly fancied opponent.
- Sam Eason's 8/40 against GWCC 3rd X1 was a further reminder of his all round ability and that the Club has a number of similar players capable of "stepping up".

It appears that general player availability has improved and this has increased team stability leading to better results in almost every grade. Over 120 players represented the Club in the seven grades but thankfully the numbers of weekly team changes were

greater in the lower grades than in the upper grades. This is a significant factor in the Club's resurrection as a force in GCA Division 1.

My observations as an "outsider" coming in are all very positive. The playing group is strong in numbers and in its desire to improve and become a force in the GCA. The players are well supported by an energetic and efficient Committee that provides excellent facilities. If these are my observations then we shouldn't feel uncomfortable recruiting people to our club. I would encourage our players to be active in recruiting when the opportunity arises. All you need is to know what we offer, what is good about our Club and that we will embrace and look after new players. Recruiting is an extremely important part of our existence and should be shared by all of us.

I would also like to thank the players who completed the Club's Player Survey at the end of the season. It was good to get feedback from a cross section of our players on training, coaching, leadership and personal experiences. Player feedback will help us to improve the way we do things.

The highlights for me looking back over my first season at Newtown & Chilwell were:

- The success of the lower grades
- Successfully managing the seven teams
- Players and their friends and families enjoying themselves in the Clubrooms on Thursday and Saturday evenings.
- Clare Hamilton's catering in the Club's kitchen.
- The obvious improvement in the turf playing group.

As I look towards the pre-season program I think there will be a greater focus on improving the technique of individual players in the 3 key areas of the game (batting, bowling and fielding) in the hope that they will play with confidence and greater all round consistency in the next season.

Our batsmen need to place more value on their wicket, so that NCCC teams are capable of batting out the allotted number of overs and our bowlers have to be able to consistently bowl on one side of the wicket.

I hope that established NCCC players, Cory Mathieson, Yves Roussety and Anthony Wilson enjoyed this season and that they will approach the coming season with renewed confidence and be leading players in our 1st X1.

I also look forward to a large group of emerging players already in the Club competing for selection in our two turf teams. Pressure for selection from players in the teams below will hopefully produce good performances in the turf teams.

We do need to become the best fielding Club in the GCA so that catches are taken, opposition batsmen are forced to take risks, run outs occur regularly and our bowlers are well supported.

This has been my first season at the Club and I have really enjoyed it and I wish to thank all who have made it so enjoyable, especially the playing group and I want you all to know that I made a very good decision when I agreed to accept the coaching role at this great club.

Most pleasing for the 2010/11 was the rapid improvement of the overall playing group over all grades of competition @ the Newtown & Chilwell Cricket Club.

- Semi-final victory versus East Belmont when we were bowled out for 75 and then E/B were 1/36 in reply. The next 9 wickets were achieved for only 30 runs in what was one of the most courageous wins that I have been involved with in over 30 years of cricket. The fact that each member of the team contributed with the ball bowling and in the field just made me proud to be playing for the "Two Blues". To never lose the belief that anything was achievable was fantastic
- Reaching the Grand Final playing Bell Post Hill (a side that had dominated one day cricket in the lower grades for several years) and again from almost letting the game get away from us @ 8 / 51, it took Mitchell Davis to launch an unforgettable counter attack with the bat making 33 and allowing us to reach 98 and in with a chance. He was rewarded with the Medal for best player which included taking 3 / 13. Although we were not successful, the spirit & belief that had been generated over the season came through and with BPH @ 9/99 and us losing, the post mortem whilst not savouring victory, I could not have imagined that I could have asked for more of all of the players in a game that will live in our memories forever. We all felt that we had given 100% and had made the opposition win the game.

Whilst we will and can reflect on so many minor instances within the game, the bottom line is that when I looked around the team on the day, there were so many great achievements that we

should all be proud of as a team & club.

The development of so many of our youngsters, integrated with several fantastic “older” players meant that each week provided another challenge to be competitive. Playing over 40 players in 16 games meant a roll call each week but also introduced several “new” names to the club in Darryn Lyons (Mr Paparazzi), Daniel Courtney, Ross Corbett & Hayden Down just to name a few.

Other pleasing aspect was the positive environment that allowed several of our up & coming players to integrate and contribute to several results through out the year. Names like Davis, Barnes, Jefferies, Sheahan (Jai) Rutherford & Sudweeks and then some input from Geelong College boys in Edward Ratcliffe, George Chisholm & George Cameron, all of the above players that can provide a backbone for future playing stocks of the club.

Whilst we could not get the end success we had worked for, several individual highlights of the year included:

- James Ratcliffe’s overall contribution to the team performances that saw him be the GCA competition’s leading strike bowler with 26 wickets @ 9.35 (Strike-rate of 21.77) Playing cricket with James is a privilege for me as he is such a positive person to have around – his other significant achievement was winning the NCCC batting average with 223 runs @ 22.3 and in my belief he can certainly be a key player for the club at a higher level
- Andrew Bishop continues to be a “first player picked” and just his desire for the contest within a game meant that he was the person to get the ball when the game was on the line. He snuck under James for the club bowling average with 18 wickets @ 8.83 (Strike rate of 20.39) His bowling effort in the semi-final when he produced 4 / 6 off 8 overs after making 23 runs in our paltry 75 was a testament to what sort of character this guy is made of. Hopefully we can sneak a few more years out of “Bish” on the field.
- Jai Sheahan’s 160 n/o vs South Barwon in round 5 out of 6 / 215 and the demolition of the previous year’s premiers was something that will not be forgotten – and he still had 10 overs to bat....!!!
- George Cameron’s 94 n/o vs Grovedale out of 8 / 135 allowed us to sneak a TIE in a result that would become crucial at year’s end...
- Our overall bowling efforts throughout the year continued to keep us in several tight game and this can be attributed to the efforts of the above and then the likes of Jake Simonsen (10 wickets @ 19.5), Mitch Davis (13 @ 13.46), Nick Harrison (8 @ 15.75), Jai Sheahan (8 @ 10.38) and Darryn Lyons (7 @ 7.76)

Whilst a premiership would have been a super way to finish the year, I have thoroughly enjoyed the year over-seeing the development of the club’s playing stocks at this level.

Look forward to the 2011 / 2012 season ahead with such a promising platform to work with our combined desire to get back amongst the finals action for all the NCCC teams.

The Other 'Secret Weapon' was Kane Grambeau. Kane was recruited in the second half of the season. His 3 unbeaten scores of 50+ in a row helped catapult us into the Grand Final. Kane unfortunately broke a finger during the Grand Final and was unable to bat.

Vale. Our 'Dad's Army' retirement list also included David Lavars. Unfortunately David became ill suddenly and passed away during the season. We all consider ourselves privileged to have played with and known David. David was a member of our first winning side against Newcomb at the Newcomb Secondary College. He was on a hat trick at one stage during his short bowling spell.

I would like to thank all players for their assistance and cooperation throughout the season. It is not easy to give all eleven (11) players an opportunity to perform in a forty (400 over innings. All players displayed great patience to take their turn, sometimes completely sacrificing a turn in favour of the side ensuring a victory on our march to the finals. Hopefully an enjoyable year by all involved.
