Let’s make sure it stays that way.

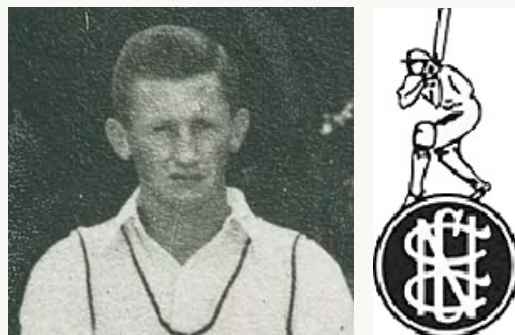
We have many great men at our club worthy of praise, and as we’re seeing in the Fourths – and elsewhere - many great young men.
