Newcomers, and an old hand, take out top awards – now let's start getting ready for next summer!

Two newcomers to the Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club, and a returning old hand, after taken out three of the top honours for season 2014/2015.

That returning old hand, Rod Kiddle, showed there is still plenty of life in those fragile legs and bruised arms of his by winning the batting average.

Marc Carson, in his first year at Queens Park after a stellar Premier Cricket career, continued to gain recognition for his prowess with the ball by winning the bowling average.

And the Merriman Medal, named after a family which has served us so well over the years on and off the field, was won by the brilliant young English player, Daniel Lawrence, the fifth player to come to us from Essex under the Gooch/Insole Scholarship.

News of the medal would have topped off a great week for Daniel, coming at the same time as he made his First XI debut with his county – and one we might also count as our county - in a “friendly” against Middlesex.

Also playing in those matches was another of our Scholarship men, Jaik Mickleburgh.

Congratulations to Rod, Marc and Daniel,” said club president Phillip Morgan.

“And congratulations to all the other winners at presentation night as per Barnso’s always comprehensive end of season wrap.

“I particularly want to thank Philip Twaddle and Frank Tuskes who respectively won the “Syd Johnston & Jim Perry” trophies.

“Those two men reflect the spirit of our club.

“They are selfless and I can’t thank them enough for their efforts.

“I am thrilled to see two other stalwarts honoured for their service to the juniors, Don Royce OAM and Tony “Jaffas” Jefferies.”

The “James Fairnie” Award, another major gong announced at Presentation Night, went to the Under 13 Royce side that reached another grand final of their competition ably coached by Jason Thiele, also a major sponsor from Barry Plant Real Estate.

“In a lot of respects, it was probably a disappointing year, with only one senior side making the semi-finals,” Phillip Morgan said.

“But in other respects, it was also a highly successful year.

Nothing succeeds like Essex

Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club is thrilled to receive positive feedback from Essex about Daniel Lawrence's time with the club.

Daniel is the fifth Essex player to spend a season at Stinton Oval under the Gooch/Insole scholarship system created in 2007.

According to the Essex Academy's director, the former Test player John Childs, Daniel has returned to the county fit and in fine form and a chance to make his First XI debut.

"On behalf of our academy and the club can I take this opportunity of thanking all those involved in accommodating this young man and giving him the chance to advance his skills and personal maturity in his challenge to become a regular first team player and we hope England recognition," John Childs said.

Daniel Lawrence had an outstanding season with the club both with the bat and behind the stumps. Taking in the 20/20 competition, he scored 671 runs at an average of under 42.

There were many fine knocks to reflect upon, none better than his 191 during which the ball visited most bits of Stinton Oval.

John Childs also noted that Daniel has told him, and in the most enthusiastic terms, about the great support he received from Newtown people.

"I have had a chance to discuss his time with N&CCC and also the hosting he was given whilst with you," John said.

"He could not say enough good words about the way he was treated by all your members and especially Karen and Phil who kindly looked after him and made his stay so enjoyable."

John Childs also indicated his desire for the arrangement between Essex and N&CCC to continue long into the future.

"That is something we would like to see happen too," said club president Phillip Morgan.

"All the players who have come from Essex have given us some great performances, and some great memories.

"I know a lot of our members continue to monitor the careers of Jaik Mickleburgh, Michael Comber, Sam Arthurton, Jon Carpenter and I am absolutely sure it will be the same with Daniel.

"It will be a fantastic achievement for him if he does become a first team player with Essex, as was the case with Jaik and Michael."

The Gooch/Insole Scholar is the result of a chance meeting between N&CCC and the then chairman of the MCC, Doug Insole.

Mr Insole, a legend of both English and Essex cricket, was lamenting England's efforts in the Ashes series when it was suggested that there might be opportunities for young players to be sent to Australia to help improve their game.

He immediately reached into his pocket, pulled out a pen and a business card, wrote on the back of it and said: "Contact this person, he will make it happen."

That person was John Childs.

Mr Insole will no doubt get extra delight from the success of Dan Lawrence in Australia. They both come from the same club – Chingford, in London's north east.

"Our club would like congratulate Dan on all he achieved while with us this season," said Phillip Morgan.

"We also thank Essex for its on-going commitment to the Gooch/Insole Scholarship. As well as Doug Insole, we know how much Graham Gooch and John Childs value the program.

"We look forward to once again hosting an Essex player."

The Fairnie Trophy origins

The Fairnie Trophy is presented to the captain or coach of the Club's most successful team (including juniors).

Every year people ask the question, "Who was the trophy named after and why?"

I will share this summary of the man the trophy was named after, from notes provided by our Club Patron, David Shaw.

Edward John Wynne Fairnie was born in Fitzroy on 19 September 1885, the only child of James and Amy. His father died when he was still a boy and when his mother remarried to Jack Daniel, of the Geelong iron mongering firm, the family moved to Geelong where Fairnie attended Flinders State School.

Fairnie's first job was on the Geelong wharves as a tally clerk and it laid the foundation for his lifelong involvement in the labour movement and interest in helping the underprivileged.

He was soon representing the Wharf Labourers' Union on the Geelong Trades hall Council and became the secretary of the Geelong Eight Hours Day Committee and a member of the State Committee. His service on the Trades Hall Council was interrupted by war service during World War 1.

After the war Fairnie's two main interests were the welfare of returned soldiers and the "Soldiers' Mill". He joined the Geelong branch of the RSL and was president in 1922, 1923, 1932 and 1933; He was made a life member in 1953.

In 1933 he led a deputation to State Premier, John Allen, which resulted in the institution of Anzac Day as we know it. Other projects included the Hall of Honour built in 1923 and the erection of an obelisk outside the then RSL rooms.

In the 1950's he negotiated the purchase of land from Grace McKellar House for an RSL retirement village (for some time the residential address of N&CC Life

Member Charles Pearce and his wife Marcella).

In 1925 Fairnie was responsible for starting the Legacy movement in Geelong and served as its secretary from 1925 to 1933. From 1925 to 1941 he was chairman of the Geelong Free Library and was a trustee for 20 years. He was the first president of the Geelong Historical Society.

In 1937 he was appointed a Geelong Harbour Trust Commissioner and was regularly reappointed until his retirement in 1955 at the age of 70 years.

His contribution to the community of Geelong was recognised with the award of the OBE in 1938 and the CBE in 1945.

In 1961 he was elected to the Newtown City Council. He remained a councillor until his death on 25 August, 1967. He was buried in the Eastern Cemetery.
