N&CCC Presidents Report

as at November 3 2011

On The Ground

We were very pleased to be able to announce the reappointment of the same group of on field leaders for the following two seasons. Don Royce continues as Director Of Cricket, and has also taken over the Chairman of Selectors position. Bryan Thomas has been reappointed Club Coach and Mick Wood was reappointed as Club Assistant Coach. Ben Neville was reappointed as the Club Professional and Captain of the First XI.

We are nearly enjoying a rain uninterrupted season. This means that we have played each day but sometimes not in the conditions that we would prefer. This is a good test for all concerned and these different conditions are giving our younger players invaluable experience.

The makeup of the playing group this season sees an excess of bowlers. This adds an extra dimension as to what these players and the selectors have to contend with. This is a good test of character for all the bowlers. The rules will be simple – train, and take wickets and you will ultimately finish at the level you deserve. If you are not able to mentally cope with the disappointment of playing in a grade lower than you believe you deserve, then you will be making yourself available for many similar disappointments during your lifetime – at work and at home.

All good Newtown club members understand that it is all about the club first, the side that you are playing in second, and your own individual performance third. The great thing about cricket is that your individual efforts and achievements can be a significant contribution to your team and your club. At the conclusion of Round 3 our club sits third in the Club Championship – Our Goal for this year is to finish in the top four. Last season we finished 6th and the year before we finished last, so I don't believe that we are getting ahead of ourselves if we say that we have turned the corner and are on the way back up towards our usual lofty standards. The top four sides are all in the Four at the moment, and our goal for all seven senior teams is to play in the finals this season.

In addition to the normal season we are also participating in the GCA T20 competition. The details of the Round 1 fixture is as follows:

Off The Ground

Life Members – At the Annual Meeting in June, 3 people were awarded with one of the highest honours that our club can bestow upon them. Stephen Wells, Andrew Green and Ian Hastie were all unanimously granted Life Membership. Our congratulations to them.

Club Patron - Another significant award at this meeting was made to David Shaw who was unanimously appointed as Club Patron.

General Committee – It is very pleasing to see some of the younger players getting involved in the running of the club. Sam Eason is assisting Phillip Morgan in tasks involved in the Secretary's position. Nick Harrison is assisting Mark Ainsworth in tasks involved in the Treasurer's position. Tom Roberts is assisting Andrew Green in running the Social Committee. Scott Dimovski is assisting Don Royce in our club's participation in the Good Sports Program. It made it easier to attract a high profile Secretary in Phillip Morgan and a high profile Treasurer in Mark Ainsworth by being able to offer them an assistant.

Clubrooms – This portfolio is being shared by Max Ellis and Mark Turnley, ably assisted by Kevin Simonsen who is looking after the bar roster. This season we are attempting to primarily run the Bar by club volunteers as opposed to paying professional bar people. We would welcome an offer of assistance for some bar duty from any member or friend of the club. Brett Bentley and Andrew Green have taken on the task of keeping downstairs in good condition. All turf players are requested to do their best to clean up after each day's play to make the tasks of these volunteers easier.

Practice Wickets Complex – All is now completed except for the Equipment Shed, and the remainder of the Carpet at the front of the Hard Wicket Nets.

The weather and the use of volunteer labour have been contributing factors. We still anticipate an official completion date prior to the end of the season. We will be having an official opening but are as yet unsure of when this will take place. It is and will be a magnificent addition to our Sporting Venue. We would not have got to this stage if it had not been for the outstanding contributions of Scott Mullen, Graeme Taylor and David Murray, and of course many playing members, plus the odd mum and Dad of our younger players who assisted at working bees.

Financial Budget – Depending on the final cost of the shed for the Practice Wickets unfortunately this season's budget will be under estimated by \$ 12,000 - \$ 15,000. This is due to:

- (i) A Soil Invoice that got overlooked as what was ultimately provided was in excess of the original plans. What was provided was what was needed however.
- (ii) The carpet which is soon to go down on the Hard Wicket Cement was not included in the Original estimates
- (iii) The Shed has to be managed by a registered Builder as opposed to the Owner – Builder option that we were originally going to use. This will cost us extra.

To assist to overcome this situation all members of the Newtown Cricket Community

e.g. Current Senior and Junior Players as well as past Players will be receiving a letter before Xmas asking for donations to cover this deficit. In particular we will be targeting current users who are time poor in their ability to help out in the club in other ways. We will be expecting special consideration from time poor parents of Junior players and younger players who will be the beneficiaries of this facility for many years to come.

Other important club activities coming up include:

- (i) Ladies High Tea on Saturday afternoon November 12
 - (ii) Presidents Dinner on Saturday evening December 3 – we have in mind an AFL Premiership flavour.
