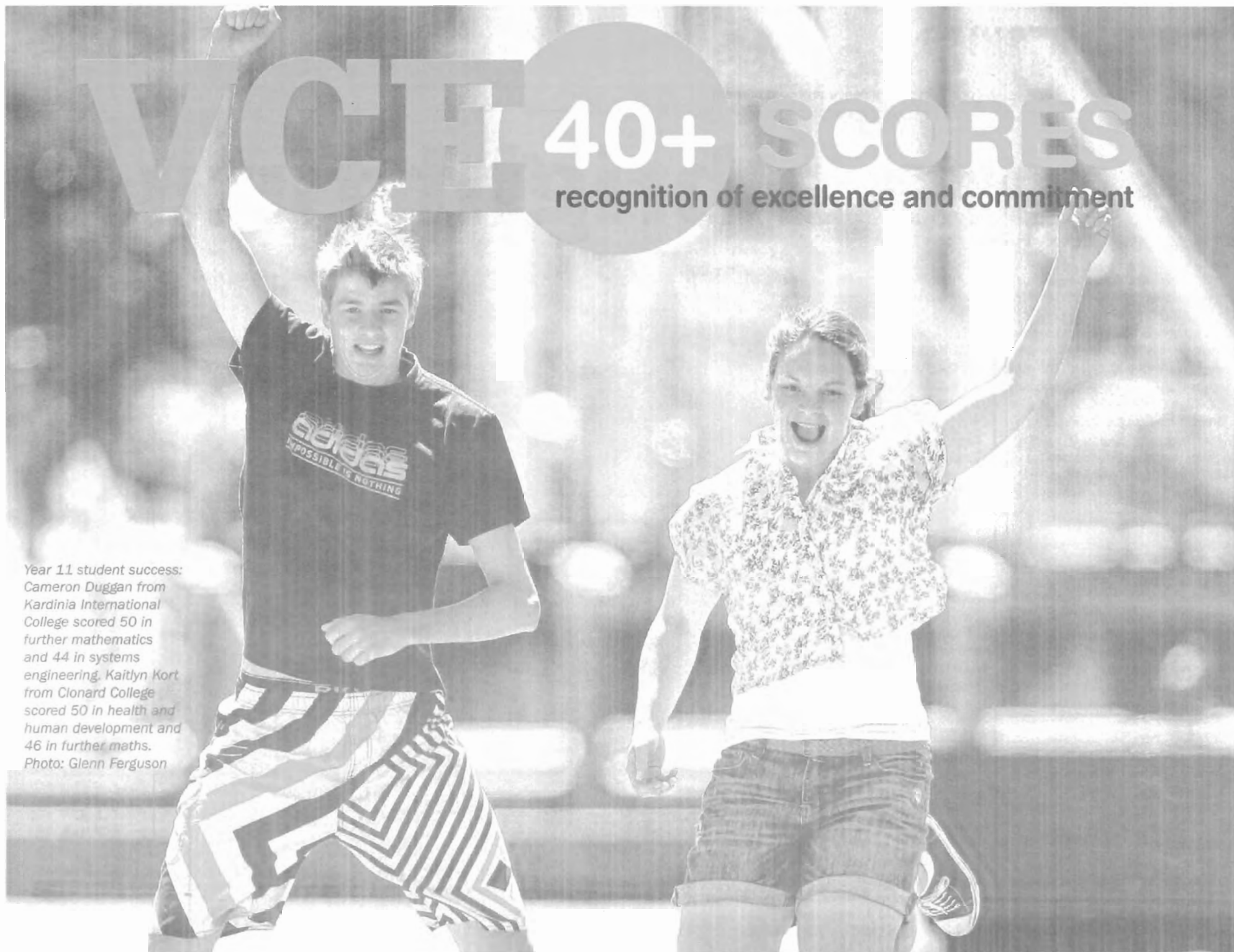

GEELONG students have reason to celebrate after achieving top Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) study scores.

As well as receiving their ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank) this week, students were given scores out of 50 for each subject successfully completed in 2011.

The number of students eligible to graduate with a VCE this year was more than 51,000 with more than 82,000 students sitting at least one exam.

The five most popular VCE subjects this year were English, further mathematics, psychology, mathematical methods (CAS) and health and human development with Geelong students scoring high in all of these subjects.

There were plenty of perfect scores, with a number of students scoring 50 out of 50.

Kaitlyn Kort from Clonard College, scored 50 in health and human development and 46 in further maths.

"I went online first thing in the morning to find out my results and called mum straight away," she said. "She was so happy."

Kaitlyn, who wants to be a part of Doctors Without Borders, which provides medical care to countries in need, puts her high scores down to smart studying.

"I put up facts all around the house that I had to remember for the exams," she said. "This way they are always around and you don't have to learn them by just sitting down and starting at them."

Cameron Duggan from Kardinia International College scored 50 in further mathematics and 44 in systems engineering.

The engineering enthusiast said it was hard work but worth it.

"I did heaps of practice exams and lots of study," he said. "I'm really happy with the result."

William Rowland from Geelong High School scored 49 in English, 48 in literature, 48 in Australian history and 40 in media, making him dux of his school with a score of 98.65.

"I am so overwhelmed and happy. I really didn't believe it when I first saw my scores," he said.

Despite his high score though, William said he is more than happy with his decision to study arts at Melbourne University next year.

"I just want to do what I enjoy and not do something because I feel obligated to," he said. "I think I want to do teaching."

The Geelong Advertiser honours the students who earned a study score of 40 or better and gave permission to have their names published.
