It says a lot about our club that when we go out into the market place seeking people of great achievement to come to speak at events like Centenary dinners or President's functions, we need to look no further than to our own.

Last year at the Centenary Dinner, Greg Wells gave his unforgettable "This Club, Our Club" speech, to be followed by one of the world's best known cricket administrators, formally known as R.F. Merriman A.M., Mayor of the Borough of Queenscliffe, but to most of us as "Brown Arms."

Yeah, we lost the six grades underneath, and in some cases lost spectacularly, and that has to hurt, particularly Morgo,

who does such a Trojan job off the field that he deserves better luck on it. What a servant of our club this bloke is, re-visiting roles he first undertook as a teenager and about 100 new one that didn't exist back then.

Anyway, the news filtering through from East Belmont throughout the day offered plenty of hope for the upset the captain had predicted in the paper the day before. Simply, the firsts, the young and the not so young, fielded like demons and bowled one side of the wicket. It's amazing how often it works.

Beating a great club like East Belmont in the firsts is a significant milestone on the road to recovery.

There were other milestones, too.

The President played his 400th game for the club, called to arms just half an hour before play, and almost won the game for the Sixths.

And in that game Adam O'Connor took his 149th and 150th wicket with successive balls of such lethal intent and delivery that D.G. Bradman wouldn't have laid willow on leather.

And we would have celebrated like Dervishes if Adam hadn't told us the wickets were numbers 148 and 149. Oh well!

As we plan ahead, be aware that Leopold were watching very closely the events of last weekend, particularly in the Firsts.

They know not to take us lightly, as others might have done.

The next big social occasion is February 4th – the TRIVIA NIGHT.

Make sure we have reasons to celebrate when we all congregate at the club rooms again for that.

Our cricket club needs your help

As you will already know, we are the most successful cricket club in the history of the Geelong Cricket Association. However throughout our 101 years it has been about a lot more than winning games of cricket. It has also been about helping young people to get the best out of themselves both on and off the field.

I have been involved in the club for five decades, and I have witnessed many young people start with our club as juniors, work their way to the seniors, along the way growing into highly regarded members of our community.

My committee members and I get a thrill out of seeing this happen year after year. We want to see this great work continue for another 101 years. This is where you can help us.

Before I outline just what help is needed, there are some issues and challenges ahead that the committee thought I should make you aware of.

(i) Coaching – Juniors

Our Junior Co-Ordinator Tony Jefferies has been able to utilise a mixture of parents and players to assist in the training, coaching, and administrating of your son's team. Tony has also ensured that an opportunity is being given to some players to also train occasionally with the seniors, and thus have individual access to the senior coaching staff.

(ii) Coaching – Seniors

The Coaching Panel of Don Royce – Director; Bryan Thomas – Coach and Mick Wood – Assistant Coach – one of the finest coaching panels in Geelong - is available to your boys on a full time basis when they graduate to senior ranks.

(iii) Practice Facilities

The new training facilities – both hard and turf wickets – are nearing completion. We are hopeful that Tony Devlin, one of our Life Members, with some other club helpers will be able to lay the remaining carpet on the hard wickets during the Christmas break. These facilities are the result of a combined effort of some players and parents. In particular, the contributions of Scott Mullen, Graeme Taylor, David Murray, Ian Simpson, and Tony Devlin need to be acknowledged. A formal opening of these facilities will occur once they are completed and paid for.

(iv) Club Finances

Despite the careful savings plan of our club over the last few years, and the support of the City of Greater Geelong, we are approximately \$10,000 short in covering the expected overall cost of the new practice facilities (\$160,000 instead of \$150,000).

We are therefore making an impassioned plea to the parents of our juniors to contribute to this cause.

These facilities will not only be used by your children this season but for many seasons to come as they graduate through our junior ranks to senior level.

How things have changed.

Now, we have a minimum of six players absent every week.

Recently, one of our regulars planned his birthday party on a Saturday. Yep, match day.

Ben's big on his role with Blues

WHENEVER Newtown & Chilwell compile a big innings total, usually there's no need to check which player has made the biggest contribution.

Over recent seasons Ben Neville has been the foundation behind the Blues' runscore and the curly-haired batting star has been incredibly consistent, hitting nearly 1000 runs over the past three summers.

Perhaps last Saturday at Winter Reserve he reached his peak making a superb 113 against one of the finest attacks in GCA, East Belmont.

It helped Newtown & Chilwell compile a very competitive 262.

"We have a young side so the responsibility and pressure on me to score runs is just the way it is," Neville said.

"(But) I enjoy the challenge. I have to concentrate on accumulating runs over long periods at the crease. Batting with inexperienced batting partners requires patience."

Apart from a stint with Premier Club, North Melbourne, Neville has played his cricket at Queens Park since juniors.

Possibly one of the few captain-coaches to ever be in charge of preparing the post-match toasted sandwiches, he is pleased that the threat

of relegation for the GCA's most successful club has eased.

"I think we are fourth in the club championship at the moment," Neville said.

"So the club is heading in the right direction. We started to put the right people in the right places - including some excellent specialist coaches.

"No one person can do everything."

A scalp like third-placed East Belmont would be another step in rebuilding Newtown & Chilwell's standing.

"Last Saturday, we did not quite bat the 65 overs as we had set out to do," Neville said.

"And they are a strong batting side so they are capable of making 262."

"A young talented side like ours can surprise people, though. What we can do is achieve some consistency in the field and bowl one side of the wicket. If we can give it a good go all day the result will be close."

Neville, who has worked in alternative therapies, currently earns his living walking dogs for their owners in Melbourne's wealthiest suburbs.

"I've got a good lifestyle at the moment. I'm enjoying my cricket and this is the best job I have ever had," he said.

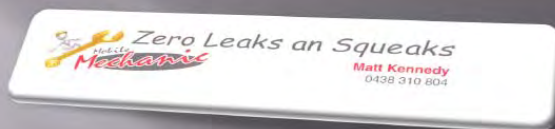
