Six in running for finals

Six of Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club's seven senior sides are in line to play finals this summer.

This follows the elevation of the First XI to the GCA's top six after the solid win over Leopold last weekend.

The firsts are in sixth spot, just ahead of a group of other clubs on percentages.

Maintaining that position will be a huge challenge over the last few weeks of home and away matches.

Other teams in finals contention are the seconds, thirds, fourths, fifths and sevenths.

Last weekend, the sixths showed they can still shape the finals by knocking off the top side.

The improving overall performances of the top four sides also has Newtown better-placed in this year's club championship.

The club is in sixth spot on 54 points behind the powerhouses Grovedale, East Belmont, South Barwon, St Joseph's and Geelong West.

Happily, it is a long way from the threat of relegation that hovered over the club in its Centenary Year, however, there is still a long way to go to achieve the ultimate goals the club has set itself.

NEWTOWN & CHILWELL 8-278 def LEOPOLD 218

Blues prove true finals contender

NEWTOWN & Chilwell - the GCA's easybeats two summers ago - finds itself on the cusp of a finals appearance following Saturday's 60-run win over Leopold at Stinton Oval.

The young and enthusiastic Blues had control of the game for most of the afternoon and withstood a late challenge from the Lions to emerge with the crucial six points.

The result has Newtown & Chilwell in seventh spot on the table, equal on points with sixth-placed Bell Post Hill heading into a showdown with the in-form Geelong West next round.

"We are ahead of where I thought we would be already," Newtown & Chilwell coach Bryan Thomas said.

"They are a young side and they compete for 85 overs and that is all I ask.

"We have two huge games in front of us (against Geelong West and Grovedale) and if we got to play in even one final the boys would be rapt.

"They talk and keep themselves up all day. It was a hot day and there were some hard periods, but they kept fighting it out."

Chasing 279 to win, the Lions top order once again showed its frailties as they collapsed to 7-84 and an early finish was on the cards.

"If you get Ben O'Brien and Becker Nguyen early you are generally on top of Leopold," Thomas said.

The Lions rally was led by veteran Rod Kiddle.

Throughout the afternoon he batted with patience and composure before being the ninth man dismissed for 92.



Rod Kiddle made a gallant 92.

"Rod Kiddle loves playing at Queens Park," Thomas said.

"He knows that after tea the bounce in the wicket is true. So he just prods on the front foot and you can't get him out.

"On that track you are never totally out of the game whatever the score."

Kiddle and Luke Murray (60) added 121 for the eighth wicket to get Leopold within striking distance of the target before the last three wickets fell for 13 to spinners Ben Neville (3-28) and Justin Maher (3-88).

Maher, in his first game for Newtown & Chilwell since crossing over from GCA2 side Thomson, carried a huge workload.

The diminutive leg-spinner sent down 27 overs and picked up three important wickets, including the last man Aaron Randall trapped in front.

"He just took a break from sport," Thomas said of their late season recruit. "But he has got the bug back, was cleared and we were thrilled with how well he went as it is a year since he has bowled in a match."

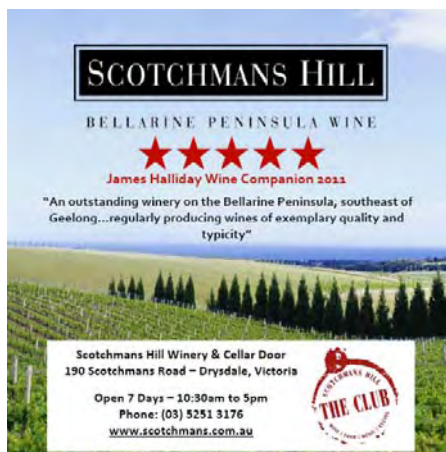

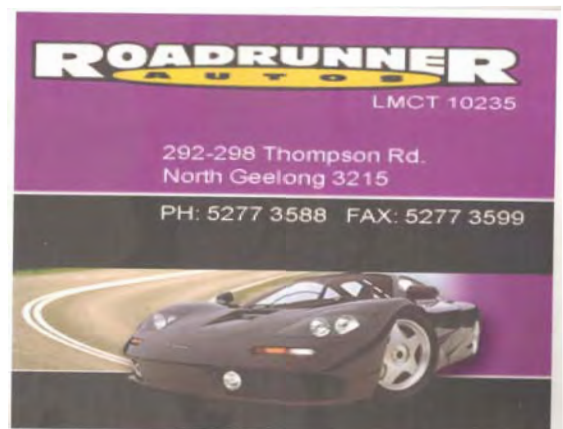
