New life under Riley

RILEY Ferguson may be the youngest captain to lead a first XI side in the Geelong Cricket Association this season.

Ferguson, 17, has been appointed skipper of the Two Blues, who will begin their 2012-13 campaign against grand finalist Geelong West in round one this Saturday.

Newtown director of cricket Don Royce said Ferguson, who will be assisted on the field by co vice-captains Ben Neville and Justin Foss, had shown maturity beyond his years. "Riley's a youngster in age but we see him as a capable young man," Royce said.

"He's demonstrated leadership in captaining the Barwon under-18 rep side. The two playing coaches have confidence in him, and I've seen him play and I've got confidence.

"He's got two very experienced cricketers as co vice-captains in Ben Neville and Justin Foss who are happy to support his appointment. On the surface it sounds like the club's taken a risk but we have every faith in Riley and he may be only 17 but he conducts and presents as more mature than that as a footballer and cricketer."

Ferguson, a former skipper of the Barwon Rockets and a St Joseph's College Year 12 student, said he was excited to take the next step in his young career.

"I'm looking forward to playing. It will be good to work with Ben and Fossy and hopefully we can play some good cricket," he said.

Royce said he watched Ferguson blast a brilliant 153 against Lara in season 2010-11, rescuing his side from 5-22 and withstanding the pace of former Pakistani quick Shahid Mansoor to help the Two Blues post 9-326.

"He was only 16 at the time and the composure he showed and the decision making was fantastic," Royce said.

"Kids emerge every now and again and you know they understand the game and demonstrated that then.

He played in the first XI last year and he had a series of outs but he managed himself magnificently and picked up a couple of half centuries before the season was out.

"He has all the attributes of a promising player and it will be his decision ultimately when and if he goes to Geelong Cricket Club.

"I would hope that in time he plays Premier Cricket and the experience he gets captaining our first XI will stand him in good stead."

Royce said the club was in the business of developing its young list.

"This is both mine and our (coach) Brian Thomas's third year and, prior to that, our first XI didn't win a game for two years but in the last two seasons they've managed to win some games and the club has climbed up the mid-range of the club championship," he said.

The Two Blues have recruited English first-class player Jon Carpenter from Essex, John Simson and Will Handley from Geelong College and Jake Ibbs from Geelong Cricket Club and retained Jackson Davis.

The outs for this season include Matt Kennedy (believed to be playing at Deakin), Peter Lynch (year off), George Cameron (injured) and Justin Maher (overseas).

Points level playing field

THE gap between the competition's cashed-up and battling clubs will be bridged under a new player points system, Geelong Cricket Association president Grant Dew says.

The GCA is set to unveil the player points system regulation, a format used in the Victorian Turf Cricket Association to create a level playing field, in season 2012-13.

"We want to be able to ensure the integrity of the regulations are being preserved, and it's designed to ensure that our playing professionals were monitored," Dew said.

"It rewards clubs for promoting juniors and for bringing players through the junior program and into their team. There's been rumours about people not necessarily abiding by that. Some of our comparable associations - the VTCA - have brought in this system, and it has been used in football previously."

Each player is assigned a points value and clubs are restricted in the amount of players they can select in any one game, with a cap of 48 points per first XI.

Under the points system:

PREMIER first XI, interstate grade/district first XI and overseas internationals with a contract will earn a 10-point rating;

OVERSEAS first-class players (List A Twenty20 and county contracted), nine points;

OVERSEAS players, Victorian Premier Cricket players with fewer than three games in two seasons and sub-district with more than 10 games, eight points;

PREMIER second XI, seven points;

SUB-DISTRICT second XI and GCA senior players with fewer than 10 games experience, six points;

VICTORIAN Country Cricket League players and Premier third XI, five points;

PREMIER fourth XI, four points;

PLAYERS returning to their junior club to play first XI, two points;

ANY player receives a point reduction after each completed season; and A PLAYER previously rated a GCA junior returning directly from premier or sub-district level to his former club will receive a 50 per cent discount.

"If there's a junior player at a club, let's say it's Glen Talarico at Geelong West, he is discounted because he came through the junior ranks," Dew said.

"Clinton Peake is a Premier cricketer and a 10-point player, and he's gone back to his junior club, South Barwon, and gets a 50 per cent reduction, so Clinton goes from a 10-point player to a five-point player.

"We also have loyalty points, so for instance, Clinton was a five last year, so this year he will be a four.

"Players who are 10-year players become a two."

Dew said the system would help to create a more level playing field.

"The main benefit is going to be that all the clubs have the opportunity to compete against each other in recruiting - and we want everyone to be able to compete, not just the big clubs - and we want to make sure the gaps between the haves and the have-nots is not too wide," he said.

"It allows all clubs to compete, it allows all clubs to recruit because all players lose a point at the end of the year, and that creates space in the cap.

"And as you bring the juniors through, it creates more space."

New GCA card system to stamp out bad behaviour

GEELONG cricket umpires will be armed with disciplinary cards this season in an unprecedented move to stamp out poor on-field behaviour.

The Geelong Cricket Association has followed the path of country football in handing umpires yellow and red cards to deter players from abusing opponents and officials.

"We've been working with the umpires to beef up the system and we've brought in yellow and red cards," GCA president Grant Dew said.

"Previously, if you got three cautions in two games you'd miss a game but now if you get two cautions you will be suspended for a game. If you get a third caution, you will miss finals."

Under the GCA's revised player discipline system:

PLAYERS who receive two cautions (yellow cards) will cop a one-match ban.

THREE cautions during the course of the season will result in a two-match suspension and a ban from playing finals.

ANY indiscretion beyond three cautions will result in a one-match ban for every reported on-field incident.

A **RED** card is an instant report and the incident will be referred to the tribunal as normal.

NEITHER card carries a send-off power, meaning players can remain on the field if they are given a red or yellow card.

While there has been no change to the league's code of conduct, the cards are designed to act as a physical indication of a player's poor behaviour as opposed to just a verbal warning.

Umpire numbers are also down, with only 28 officials set to officiate in this weekend's Round 1 matches. This is despite the GCA's financial incentives to clubs who recruit umpires.

"Everyone has a responsibility to the game the captains, umpires and the players and we're putting the message out there that cricket will be enjoyed by anyone," Dew said.

"We've worked with our clubs on this and we didn't get any feedback that anyone was unhappy with it."

Dew said bad behaviour would not be tolerated.

"If you go out and kick the stumps over, you'll get a red card," he said. "It's not a send-off, but it's a physical indication of a report."

Dew said the card system was implemented after lengthy discussions with the Geelong Football Umpires League.

"We have football umpires who are cricket umpires and they feel cards can take the heat out of situations," Dew said.

"The association believes it will be a definite sign that players will know what to expect and it will help ensure that players are playing within the code of conduct."

Preseason program wrap

The preseason program is when players prepare for the first Saturday in October, normally over 6-8 weeks, initially in indoor facilities until the outdoor facilities are available and often at odd times on Sundays and in the evening. Not everyone is able to attend regularly due to other sporting, work or school commitments so any attendance is appreciated.

This year our preseason featured a number of activities that were well attended and gave our coaches and player leaders good reason for optimism.

The first activity initiated by Club Treasurer, Mark Ainsworth, supported by Bryan Thomas and run by Mark & Justin Foss was a comprehensive 12 week program starting on 28 May and designed to improve the core strength and individual fitness of all involved. Participants were tested before during and at the end of the program. Essentially the activities were completed in Mark's parents home gym in Highton.

While I only managed to observe the last session it appeared to be a most successful program for the people involved (ranging from the experienced Terry Hickey to youngsters in Harry Gow & Nick McGuane). Not only was it a worthwhile program but it identified early in the off season, a group of NCCC players prepared to make an extra effort to improve their physical well being before the next season came around.

Ten indoor practice sessions on Friday evenings and Sunday afternoons ran from 5 August until 16 September. Thanks to Mark Duggan's record keeping we know that 61 different players attended these sessions with Sam Eason and Yves Roussety attending all 10 and 35 players made the effort to attend 5 or more of the scheduled sessions. Apart from impressive attendance figures, activity in the Gravel Pits Road establishment was energetic and structured. It was also an impressive demonstration for people from other GCA clubs to observe the level of commitment, unity and focus.

On a recent Friday evening when the Swans put the Magpies out of the AFL finals another impressive number of NCCC players and a couple of officials sacrificed their normal Preliminary Final night to attend a pre season camp at the Staughton Vale Outdoor Education Centre for some healthy social interaction and some focus on Club teamwork and leadership. It was also an opportunity for players new to the club to be introduced to the existing group and for the existing group to also be exposed to their new team mates. While the catering was not exactly 5 star, the facilities were very good, we left the venue in the condition we found it and feedback from those in attendance suggests that it was a successful overnight activity. Once again I was impressed with the attendance and the commitment of our players to make it a successful event.

Preseason culminated in a couple of weeks batting & bowling in the outdoor nets as well as fielding on Stinton Oval courtesy of the good preparatory work of Graeme Taylor and Ian Simpson. Maybe it's not often that we include an article in the Two Blue Tribune about our preseason activities but it should be acknowledged and recorded that Bryan Thomas our coach has encouraged others to add some spice to our pre season program and that a good core exists within our playing group of people keen to participate in activities that prepare them for the first Saturday in October and beyond.
