Another boundary for tireless Devlin

ANTHONY Devlin has dedicated almost 35 years to Newtown & Chilwell Cricket Club.

Devlin has been a captain, served on the committee, coached and long shaped the club.

He's a four-time premierships player, life member and fifth on the club's all-time leading runscorer's list.

And tomorrow Devlin, a "treasured" clubman and "favourite son", will tick off another milestone.

"You don't plan these things when you first start playing cricket. You play to enjoy cricket and then time flies and before you know it you're playing 400 games," Devlin said.

"It's snuck up on me. At the start of the year I knew I was on 391.

"One game flows on to another and the seasons come and go and before you know it you've reached another milestone."

Devlin recalled the year he arrived at Queens Park, lining up alongside Graeme Chisholm in the fifth XI in 1981-82. He was just 17. "Phillip Morgan was one of my childhood friends and there was a half dozen of us that wandered down to the club," Devlin said.

"They were playing in the firsts, and they played their juniors down at Newtown, and I came down in '81."

Devlin has constructed a neat cricket resume over 399 games spread from the seconds to the sixths.

He has collected four flags (one in the thirds, one in the fifths and two in the sixths) and five tons (two in the fourths and three in the fifths).

The right-hander has strode to the crease for 379 innings, remained unbeaten 46 times, hit 7627 runs at an average of 22.90 and belted a highest score of 154.

Devlin has made more than 500 runs in the thirds, fourths, fifths and sixths, made 35 fifties, 21 ducks and taken 117 catches.

He has rolled the arm over for 2097.66 overs, delivered 498 maidens, snared 266 wickets at an average of 20.62 with his medium pacers.

Nine times he has claimed five wicket hauls, with a best of 6-24.

"I was only an average cricketer but if you stick at it for long enough sometimes good things come your way," Devlin said.

"I started as a bowler allrounder but as you get older bowling becomes a bit difficult.

"I probably haven't bowled for 15 years, I just bat. I started playing at Newtown when they were really strong.

"When I first arrived they were halfway through their six flags in a row. I played in a thirds premierships and in the seconds but I was mainly a thirds and fourths player."

And despite the fact he is nudging 50, and dealing with the "wear and tear" of a life spent working as a carpet layer, cricket has never been a burden.

"I've always loved cricket. It was cricket during the summer and footy during the winter," he reflected.

"I've always been involved with Newtown, coaching the juniors, working on the committee, I'm a life member — I really enjoy it.

"I still get down to the club. I don't train much these days but I'm still part of the club."

The highlights include the Two-Blues' thirds premierships and his life membership, awarded in 2004.

"I'm the 30th life member and we've only got 32 life members in over 100 years," he said.

"I've made a lot of friends from other clubs and I've struck up a good rapport with a lot of them and we're lifelong friends."

And he's not prepared to draw the curtain on his career just yet.

"If you had've asked me that 18 months ago, I would've said I'll keep going forever," Devlin said. "But it's a lot harder now. You're playing against guys who are a lot younger than you and a lot better.

"Maybe I'll play for another couple of years. I still plan to keep playing in the fifths and sixes. There's a lot of blokes in the club that are around my age and then a lot that are 15, 16 so there's a real mixture.

"We take the game seriously but it's nothing over the top. I can honestly say I have enjoyed every moment of it."

Last-wicket heroics lift **Two Blues** over the line

IT did it the hard way, but Newtown & Chilwell finally has a reason to celebrate after snatching a dramatic one wicket win over Geelong West on Saturday.

Tail-enders Harry Christie and Mitchell Davis were yesterday hailed for their composure after they weathered pressure to put on 26 for the final wicket to steer their side to its first win of the season.

The Two Blues' chase had everything.

Geelong West will rue a couple of dropped half chances, including a tough caught-and-bowled opportunity hit back at Damian Vassiliou by Davis when the scores were tied.

The day was off to a bizarre start when Marc Carson, who was not out overnight, was retired after he could not make the start of play because of a family commitment.

Chasing 149 for victory, Newtown was seemingly cruising towards victory at 5-115 before losing 4-12 in a dramatic couple of overs that turned the match on its head.

That's when Christie and Davis came together, and between them they took the score from 9-127 to 153 all out.

"They didn't play at any ball they didn't have to, they were really composed and they knew what their job was and they just went about doing it," Newtown & Chilwell coach Rod Kiddle said.

"I told Mitch that if he had an opportunity to hit a boundary to do it, to not hold back, and they both executed really well. It didn't look like they were in any trouble at all."

Geelong West was down two bowlers from the start of play after Josh Vrbovski and Chris Martin were struck down by injury, leaving Vassiliou (4-43), Tim Wight (3-33) and Brett Russell (2-31) to shoulder the bowling load.

It also meant the Rams were forced to have two sub fielders.

"Tim Wight was by far their best bowler and he bowled a fantastic spell, the same with Brett Russell — he bowled really well in tandem," Kiddle said.

"They hardly bowled any bad deliveries.

"They really set it up well for themselves, but there were probably just a couple of missed half-chances, some 50-50 ones, that if they took one of them the result might have been different.

"There were so many twists and turns all game. It was an exciting game of cricket but not too much fun to play when it's like that."

Kiddle said the result was a reward for the hard effort his side had put in this season.

The Two Blues have been forced into a makeshift rebuild this summer after the core of their first XI side from last season left the club.

"It was such an important game for both sides because Geelong West were sitting just outside the finals and we're also both down the bottom of club champion- ship," Kiddle said.

"So it was really important for both teams to get the win, it was a massive game."

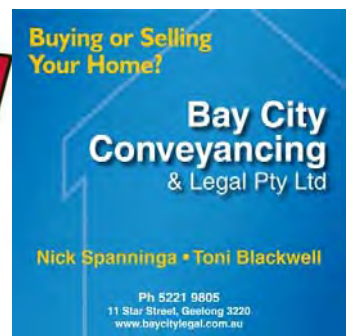
