High praise for first aid training after family saves Daryl Biviano during heart attack

DARYL Biviano was gardening at a friend's house when he started to feel ill and could not get out of his chair. Note: Daryl Biviano played 150 matches making over 2700 runs and took 124 catches and 13 stumpings with the N&CCC in the 70s and 80s including two Fourth XI premierships.

He phoned his daughter Carly, 21, for help — thankfully she answered and was able to wake her mum Lee-Anne, who had just finished night shift at an aged care home.

Together the pair raced seven minutes from Bell Post Hill to Geelong West and, when they arrived, they found Mr Biviano slumped against a wall, still in his chair.

Mrs Biviano quickly put her first aid training to use and started doing CPR while Carly called the ambulance.

“Just knowing that he wasn’t responding was quite a shock,” Mrs Biviano said.

“I was there doing compressions and going ‘don’t die on me’.

“The ambos were fantastic, they were there in very good time but it felt like ages for me doing compressions.”

Mrs Biviano said she was so thankful she had received first aid training and urged everyone, no matter what age, to learn CPR.

“It is a bit different trying it on a dummy but when you have to do it the adrenalin just takes over,” she said.

“I just never, ever thought I’d have to use it on my husband. It was quite traumatic for me but he’s here to tell the story. He’s a very lucky man.”

Mr Biviano, 55, was taken to hospital and had a stent put in his artery before undergoing triple bypass surgery five months later.

The father-of-three is still recovering at home but does intend to go back to work of some kind in the future.

The former sales manager said a combination of good luck and his family’s quick reaction definitely saved his life.

“I’m just very fortunate that all the what ifs fell my way,” he said.

“We go back over the day often and if my daughter hadn’t picked up the call I sent out to her, I wouldn’t be here.”

Mr Biviano thanked paramedics for their efforts and the commendation award they presented his wife and daughter with on Tuesday.

But mostly he is grateful for the two women who kept him alive.

“I’d like to thank my two heroes ... for letting me still be on this earth,” he said.

“They get told every day.”

A. My best achievement is a scholarship with Essex at 16 years old, this was a very proud moment.
