CLUBROOMS

The Club is in a lease agreement with the City of Greater Geelong as the co-tenant (in conjunction with the Geelong Amateur Football & Netball Club) of the Queen's Park Sporting Complex.

The agreement provides both Clubs with secure tenure on the Complex along with limited interference in the day to day running of the building. It allows us to "sub-let" the building for functions retaining any profit but, as in a normal rental agreement, requires the Club to take proper care of the Complex and oversee any necessary maintenance.

The Club's appointed Trustee, Graeme Taylor, is responsible for ensuring the smooth running of the Complex.

Members should be aware of the following:

- For six months of the year (October 1 to March 31) the Club is the tenant of the Queen's Park Sporting Complex
- We are responsible for ensuring that the rooms are clean and maintained both upstairs and down. Rubbish is to be placed in the bins provided.
- A council instruction limits the use of the building to 12.30a.m for any function.
- The building is available for rental to interested bodies for most of the year at competitive rates. All members should attempt to promote the venue as the Club receives any profit. For further information see Max Ellis or Mark Turnley. (Conditions apply on application)
- The Club pays a substantial rental so the rooms are to be used and enjoyed.
- The Club phone/fax number is 52215161.
- Members are responsible for any guests they may introduce to the rooms.
- All visitors are requested to sign the "Visitors Book" located on the entrance
- Any damage, leakage etc. should be immediately reported.
- The last member to leave the clubrooms is responsible for switching off the lights setting the alarm system and ensuring that all doors (upstairs and down) are locked.

MEMBERSHIP DUE DATES

Membership is due by **October 31st 2011**. After this time, a list will be placed on the walls in the clubrooms naming those who are un-financial. Anyone who is not financial by November 30th 2011 (which gives you a month's grace) is not registered with the GCA, not covered by insurance, and thus ineligible to play for Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club.

Paying your membership is your responsibility and the club should not have to chase you for payment.

RECRUITING

The health of the club depends on new members being available to replace members who retire or move on. Recruiting is the responsibility of all members. Invite prospective members to training. Introduce him/her to the Club Coach, President, Captains, Secretary and Members. Ascertain whether a permit (registration) or a clearance form has to be signed. All members are asked to be hospitable towards prospective and new members (i.e. talk to them and make them feel comfortable). Help new members to quickly become aware of our traditions, procedures and amenities. If you are not comfortable about inviting a potential recruit to join N & C. C. C., then pass his or her name onto a Club Official.

TRAINING RULES

- Senior training is conducted on Tuesday and Thursday evenings between 5.30 p.m. and 7.30p.m. at Queen's Park.
- Club training tops, track suit pants, and collared white shirts are acceptable attire for training. The only shorts to be worn are the club shorts. Cricket whites are always acceptable.
- Players are expected to participate in all forms of training.
- **Players are expected to notify the Coach, their team Captain or the Chairman of Selectors when they cannot attend training or are unavailable for selection.**
- In the event of inclement weather, cricket training will go on, even if not in the traditional form.
- Training attendance will be monitored and considered at team selection.

SELECTION

This season teams have been graded from one to seven and will be selected on merit in that order. The Selection Committee consists of the team Captains, Club Coach, and the Chairman of Selectors. It meets to select the teams on the Tuesday night proceeding the first Saturday of each match. The selected teams are published on the www.two-blues.com.au/Teams site on Friday morning.

CAPTAINS' RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide leadership and set examples on and off the field and at training.
- Participate in selection and organise any late replacements.
- Ensure correct payment of Umpires.
- Arrange for the score to be kept and scoreboard maintained during the match.
- Report any disputes or misbehavior to the Committee or Club Executive.
- Arrange and oversee of players to officiate as umpires when required.
- Ensure team kits remain intact and report any loss or damage.
- Support the Coach and Committee by communicating/reinforcing club information ie.announcements, social events, fund raising.
- Arrange for afternoon tea to be efficiently organised.
- Have a thorough knowledge of the Laws and Regulations governing play.
- Formulate a Captain's report for the Annual Report at the season's completion.
- First and Second XI captains are to arrange to have the turf covers in place on Friday and Thursday night.
- Complete all necessary paperwork before 7.00p.m. each day of play and place it in the filing box on the Bar.
- Return all match balls at completion of play for storage.
- Hand in scorebooks at the completion of each round for Tribune and statistical information.

THE ROLE OF THE TEAM CAPTAIN IS NOT AN EASY ONE AT ANY TIME.

Above is a list of the duties expected of our team leaders.

ALL PLAYERS ARE ASKED TO BE AWARE OF THESE MANY DUTIES AND ASSIST THE CAPTAINS WHEN POSSIBLE.

PLAYING REGULATIONS

All games are played in accordance with the Laws of Cricket and the playing rules and regulations of the Geelong Cricket Association. The Association Rule Books are held by Team Captains and Managers and copies are kept in the Clubrooms.

All players should familiarise themselves with the rules.

TIMES OF PLAY as set by the Geelong Cricket Association are:

For Season 2011/12 all two day games are scheduled to start at 1:15 p.m. (1sts – 4ths)

For Season 2011/12 all one day games are scheduled to start at 12:15 p.m. (1sts – 4ths)

- Players are required to be ready for pre match activities at least 45 minutes prior to the start of play
- Umpires must be paid by the tea adjournment
- Players are required to provide afternoon tea on both days of home matches
- Umpiring and scoring duties are to be shared by all members,
- N. C. C. C. players are required to observe the regulation referring to correct attire. (Creams for 1sts and 2nds, Whites for 3rds, 4ths, 5ths, 6ths & 7ths). Club caps and badges are desirable. White Cricket Shoes ONLY
- Caps from other clubs and colored footwear are not permitted.

AFTERNOON TEA

Players are requested to bring a plate of afternoon tea every time they play at home and place it in the kitchen.

Don't just leave your afternoon tea, label it with your team name.

THE BAR

In season 2001/02 the club joined the Good Sports Accreditation program and over the coming years will work through the program levels in order to obtain accreditation in responsible service of alcohol.

The Club Bar will operate under a restricted Club Permit during

N&C.C.C. HEALTHY SPORTING ENVIRONMENTS PROGRAM

In 2010 VicHealth appointed Leisure Networks to implement a 2.5 year, \$2 million Healthy Sporting Environments Demonstration Project (HSE Project), working with 100 community sport clubs across five local government areas in the wider Geelong region. A key objective of the project is to support clubs to become healthy sporting environments by helping them achieve a number of minimum standards. These standards relate to the responsible use of alcohol; healthy eating; reduced tobacco use; protection from harmful effects of UV; sports injury reduction; creating a safe and inclusive environment for women; and reducing race-based discrimination.

Following attendance at a number of briefing sessions, an audit of our Club's operations and receipt of relevant HSE documentation the NCCC Committee is committed to following a number of HSE guidelines to achieve improvements in how our Club operates as a "healthy sporting environment". It is pleasing to note that in many areas of this project our Club has already adopted appropriate Healthy Sporting Environment practices

For participating in this project our Club will receive \$3,500.

Furthermore an application for a grant of \$1000 to fund a temporary shading structure has been submitted due to our participation in this project.

Currently Don Royce and Scott Dimovski are the Club's HSE Contact Officers.

During this season we will be active in informing members and seeking to gain your support for achieving improvements in how we do things at Queens Park.

SUN SMART POLICY

There is a range of statistics available which cause us concern on the issue of exposure to the sun:

- * Australia has the highest incidence of skin cancer in the world, with two out of three people developing some form of skin cancer during their lifetime; current statistics show that 2 out of every 100 people have some form of skin cancer.
- * over-exposure to the sun during childhood and adolescence is known to be a major cause of skin cancer.
- * as few as 6 doses of sunburn during a lifetime can more than double a person's chances of developing a skin cancer.

The aim of the Club Policy is to minimise the dangers of excessive UV radiation exposure for both senior and junior members and to ensure a healthier environment with long term health benefits.

The goals of our policy are:

- to increase awareness of skin cancer.
- to adopt practical skin protection measures.
- to develop strategies which encourage responsible decision-making about skin protection.
- to work towards a safe club which provides shade for players and spectators.
- to encourage all members to wear protective clothing, hats and sunscreen whilst playing either on the field or watching in unprotected areas
- to continually inform new members of the clubs Sun Smart policy.

In order to support our Sun Smart policy we ask players to observe the following:

- * the compulsory wearing of hats in all game for junior members.
- * a free supply of sunscreen being made available in all kit bags.
- * senior members are encouraged to wear hats during times of play. The hat has been promoted as part of the team uniform.
- * articles on the danger of over exposure to the sun being published in the club's fortnightly newsletter.

Privacy Policy Club By-Law 25

At the N&CCC we take your privacy very seriously.

In December 2001, there was an amendment to the Privacy Act, 1988. This privacy amendment established a set of National Privacy Principles (NPPs), which set out how private sector organisations should collect, use, secure and disclose personal information.

Below is a summary of how this applies to you. These are essentially the relevant principles, which have been customised to your Membership.

- The Club will only collect personal information that is necessary for the core Membership function or associated functions.
- The Club will only ever use fair and lawful ways to collect information.
- At the time of collecting information, where necessary, the Club will make the Member aware of why it is collecting this information, who else may use it and any other specified matters.
- Members are under no obligation to provide information that is deemed by a reasonable person to be of a sensitive nature.
- The Club will use your information for the primary purpose of collection – which is to facilitate your Membership.
- The Club may also use your personal information for a purpose that is within your reasonable expectations relating to your Membership. This may include being made an offer through the Club from one of its sponsors.
- The Club will take reasonable steps to ensure the personal information collected from you is reliable, accurate and up to date.
- The Club will take reasonable steps to protect your personal information from misuse or unauthorised disclosure.

BOWLING MACHINE

At the beginning of season 1994/95 the Club purchased a bowling or baseball pitching machine for the use of players in a practice or coaching capacity.

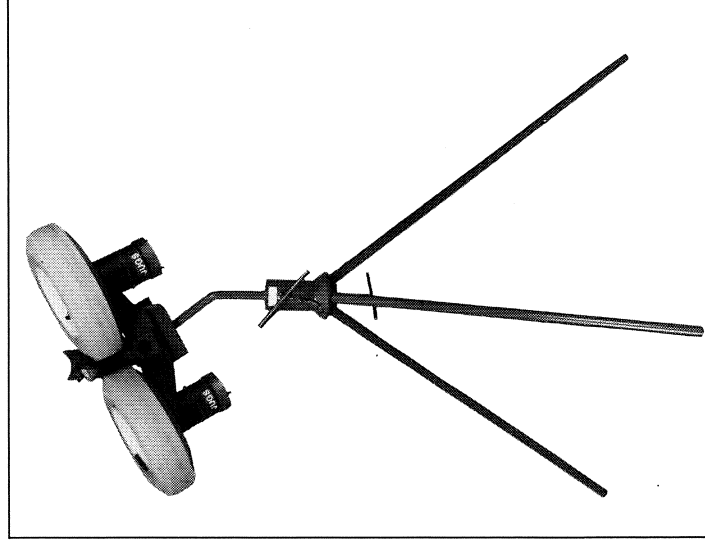
The machine is available for the use of all members under the following strict guidelines.

Please contact the Club Coach or Chairman of Selectors should you wish to use the machine outside training hours.

- The operator of the machine must take appropriate measures to ensure their own safety.
- As the machine is an electrical device it must not be used in wet conditions
- All aspects of maintenance must be reported.
- All practice balls (yellow or white) must be accounted for at the completion of each session.
- The machine is to be set at an appropriate speed for the skill level of the batsman.
- The batsman (including junior players) must wear complete protective gear, including a helmet with grid.
- The bowling machine is provided as an aid to skill development.
- There is to be no unauthorised use of the equipment
- Please ensure that the equipment is locked away in the shed at the completion of the training session.

IMPORTANT: Regardless of speed desired, keep dials 35 apart.

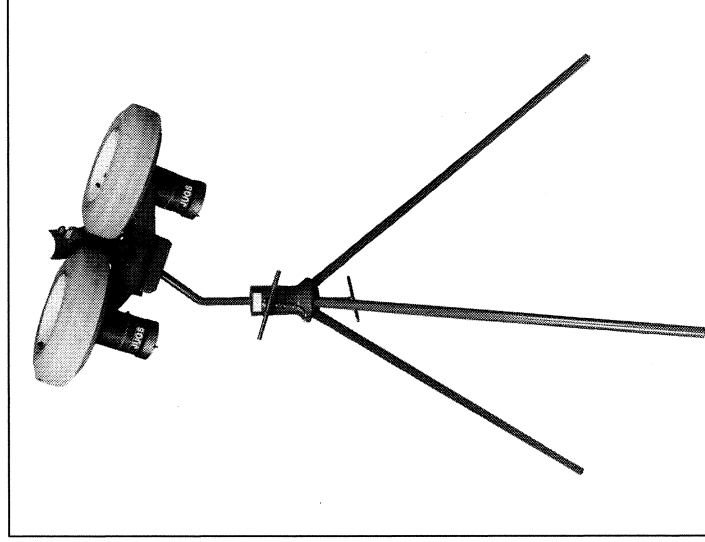

SLOW SPIN

By slowing down the overall speed and having a large speed difference between the wheels, it is possible to get off and leg spin flight through the air.

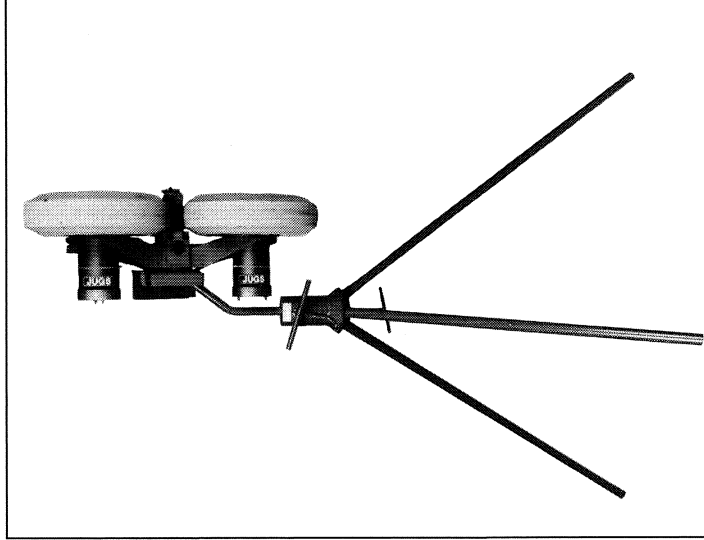

Using the setting below the ball will tend to rise, similar to a new ball delivery.

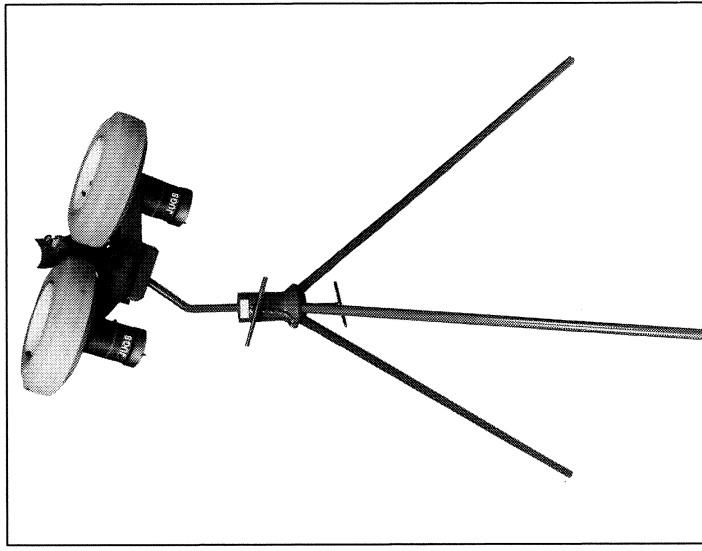
