Thirds and Fourths join Fifths in semis

The Thirds and Fourth XIs have joined the Fifths in semi finals matches next weekend after successfully defending tallies on the weekend.

The Thirds won by 52 runs after rolling St Josephs for 118 at South Barwon Common. Brendan Twaddle and Paul Dowling with four wickets each ensured the Threes advanced to the semis. On Saturday Jamie Pescott (56) and Col Cunliffe (39) combined to set the Thirds up with 170. The only disappointing note from the weekend came when Paul Marinelli ruptured ankle tendons and will miss the rest of the finals campaign.

The Fourth XI, under acting captain Stuart Day, rolled North Geelong for just 87 at Drew Reserve. While wickets were evenly spread the Magpies were never really in the race after opening bowlers Paul Smith and Ange Fatone put the screws on right from the start.

Meanwhile, the Seconds never really threatened St Joeys 220 at Lara. Losing early wickets, only Tim Stacey with 29, stood tall as the side crumbled for just 86. On Saturday Matt Jackson and Shannan Gove claimed three wickets each.
