Newtown & Chilwell Cricket Club APPLIES FOR LEVEL THREE ACCREDITATION IN GOOD SPORTS PROGRAM

The **N&CCC** is displaying commitment to responsible alcohol management with an application for Level Three accreditation under the Australian Drug Foundation's Good Sports program.

Good Sports is the first nationwide alcohol management program of its kind and is supported by VicHealth, the Traffic Accident Commission (TAC) and the Alcohol Education Rehabilitation Foundation. The program was developed following research conducted by the Australian Drug Foundation which indicated that by introducing responsible alcohol management policies, clubs were able to improve membership and enhance viability.

The club is determined to meet the criteria required for the Level Three accreditation.

We now have a written alcohol management policy which includes the sale of low alcohol drinks and soft drinks and a safe transport strategy to ensure our members get home safely. We will provide food when serving alcohol and we will not have an emphasis on alcohol for player awards or fundraising, functions and prizes.

We are confident our efforts will continue to improve the environment at the Club. We are working to ensure the **N&CCC** is a great place to play and socialise for all members of our community. Responsible Service of Alcohol courses will be made available to interested members.

The club will be regularly monitored to ensure we comply with the program. This is the responsibility of all members to make sure we do the right thing while we're enjoying ourselves and having fun.

Responsible Service of Alcohol

The RSA accreditation is mandatory within the hospitality industry and particularly valuable for those seeking part time or casual employment.

All club committee members are expected to complete the course and it is recommended that all members 17 to 25 years also be involved.

Vale Geoff Beaumont

At a time when volunteers are at a premium in our community the GCA wishes to pay tribute to one of the truly great behind the scenes contributors of Geelong cricket in Geoff Beaumont.

Geoff passed away on Sunday morning after a battle with cancer, aged 76. A true gentleman, he will be long remembered by two generations of local cricketers as a quiet, passionate supporter of the game, its values, its development, and particularly its youth.

A great supporter of Geelong junior country week since its inception many will remember Geoff's smiling face and helping hand during those hot January days. More recently his experience and organisational skills became the backbone of local representative cricket with his involvement in the

Dowling Shield, Coca Cola under 18 and under 21 Geelong teams. This fabulous contribution will be remembered by our recent generation of fine young cricketers whom would have come into contact and be influenced by Geoff during their representative pathway to senior cricket.

Over the past ten or so seasons Geoff has become the face of the Geelong Cricket Club as the first person of contact at Kardinia Park whether it be training, junior development or matches at the Geelong Cricket Ground.

The Beaumont name of course has long been synonymous with the Geelong area with Geoff and his family producing those wonderful pies and cakes for generations in our region.

Geoff's outstanding service to cricket in our region was recognised in 2000 when he was awarded an Australian Sports

Medal. The Beaumont under 13 section of Geelong junior cricket was named in his honor many years ago.

New league presents opportunity

FOUR cricket clubs have formed a Geelong league for disabled cricketers.

Newcomb, Collendina, Drysdale and Newtown and Chilwell cricket clubs have formed the Barwon Disability Cricket League.

Newcomb president Scott Smith said the league would not replace the Barwon Disability Carnival, a two-day event played at Eastern Park in

February.

Smith was impressed by the level of participation in the carnival and got the wheels turning for a tournament where players would represent clubs.

Leisure Networks, which had organised the February carnival, threw its weight behind the extended competition.

“This is putting the emphasis on club cricket, the clubs are taking the lead in organising it,” Smith said.

“We'll have four preliminary round robins played at each of the clubs on a Sunday.

“The first round is at Newcomb this Sunday.

“They'll play a game in the morning from 10am to noon and a game after a one-hour barbecue lunch break from 1pm to 3pm.

“The final will be played on the turf wicket at Geelong Cricket Club on Sunday, February 27.”

Smith said each side would have 12 players and more than 40 players were on the league's books.

“The players will rotate through the teams, not everyone will be available every week,” Smith said.

New players were always welcome, he said.

St John Ambulance Brigade would attend matches and financial support had been gained from Gordon Smith Meats, Express Skips and Ian Barnabas at LJ Hooker.
