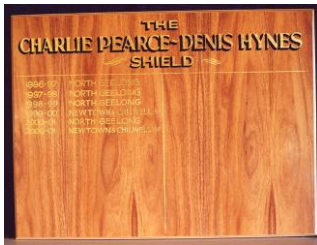

Since making his senior debut way back in 1995/96, **Tim Clark** has totalled 2650 runs at the healthy average of 26. Last Sunday "Chucky" played his **100 senior match** enjoying a victory over arch rival North Geelong. With five centuries, eight fifties and 59 catches Tim is well on the way to amassing a huge number of runs for the Two Blues.

John Rees enjoyed his 50th senior match milestone in the win on Sunday. With 1270 runs at 32 with the bat John has settled in well to the opening spot in the Ones.

Barry Tsitas has taken just 16 matches to reach the 50 wicket mark with the Two Blues. Bazz's performance in averaging three wickets a match is remarkable considering it is costing him just 10 runs per scalp at a the strike rate of 29 balls per wicket!

Three Geelong sports groups win state award

THREE local community sporting groups picked up awards at Tuesday night's Victorian Sport and Recreation Awards.

Geelong's Leisure Networks Association won the Innovative Organisation Award, Grovedale Tigers Football and Netball Club won the User-friendly Club Award and Lorne Surf Life Saving Club won the Community Award for the Pier to Pub swim.

Sports minister Justin Madden congratulated all winners across the 10 categories who received a cash prize of \$4000 and a trophy presented at the awards ceremony in Melbourne.

Lorne Surf Life Saving Club race director Josie Molloy said the club would use the prize money to continue saving lives.

"Our primary responsibility is saving lives, so the money will go towards first aid equipment. We are maybe looking at purchasing a defibrillator for the club," Molloy said.

Molloy said the club had submitted nominations for the past three years because of the community nature of the Pier to Pub.

"A lot of local community groups benefit. There's the Rotary Club of Highton, 500 volunteers from the club are involved in everything from water safety to event management. The Lorne Primary School raise money through car parking, the Lorne Football Club make the sandwiches and the CFA and SES also assist," she said.

Spokesman and former president of Grovedale Football and Netball Club Neil Duggan said the recognition the club received was "nice to have".

"It won't hurt in terms of being able to market and promote ourselves within the community," he said.

Duggan said the club had turned itself around in the past four years from being only a football club to incorporating netball and intellectually disabled football with a view to introducing intellectually disabled netball as well.

"Membership numbers have gone through the roof in the last three or four years. Over 1000 households in the Grovedale area are involved at the club. We've had a 400 per cent increase in social membership," he said.

Duggan said the prizemoney would go toward further upgrading facilities.

Leisure Networks executive officer Jill Evans said her organisation had in the past always nominated other groups but this year decided to nominate themselves.

"We thought it was a good time to put our organisation up. We really wanted to acknowledge the work that we do," Evans said.

"Everything we do is trying to be innovative. We are working to strengthen and support people in sport and recreation, primarily in clubs and organisations . . ."

MP Michael Crutchfield said he had worked closely with both the Leisure Network and Grovedale Football Club.

"I am pleased and proud that these groups in their own ways are achieving for sport and active healthy lifestyles in the region," Crutchfield said.
