## About Good Sports

Alcohol and sport are historically closely linked in Australia. Most major sporting competitions and teams promote and advertise alcohol consumption and many sports clubs have a tradition of heavy drinking. A large number of clubs depend on revenue from alcohol to finance club activities.

The Good Sports program is a partnership between the Australian Drug Foundation (ADF), national, state, regional and local sports bodies, and the government sector, to develop a safer and healthier community. The Good Sports program helps sporting clubs manage alcohol responsibly. Displaying the Good Sports logo sends an important message to club members and the community. It confirms that the club promotes a responsible attitude towards alcohol and provides a safe environment for players, members, families and supporters.

Evidence is growing which suggests that community-based sports clubs contribute to alcohol problems by accepting and promoting excessive drinking and providing inappropriate role models for young people.

A study of more than 500 young people conducted by the [Centre for Youth Drug Studies](#) (CYDS) at the ADF found:

- more than 30% of 13-17 year olds had participated in unsupervised drinking at a sports club
- 71% of these had never been asked for proof of age.

Conducted in 1999 among sporting club members, another CYDS survey revealed:

- 51% of drinkers at sports clubs are consuming alcohol at harmful or hazardous levels.

A study of community football clubs by CYDS in 2000 showed:

- 13% of 18-20 year olds drank 13 or more standard drink each time they visited the club and 83% left the club as the driver of a vehicle.

Helping sporting clubs implement alcohol practices and policies enables clubs to develop a culture that attracts families and junior players by:

- reducing binge drinking
- preventing underage drinking
- avoiding incidences of drink driving, violence and assault
- reducing the risk of potential liability by upholding 'duty of care' with respect to safety of players, members and supporters.

### Characteristics influencing success of the program:

- community attitude of the club
- support offered by parents
- support offered by committee members
- number of junior members
- pre-existing club rules and regulations
- information and resource material provided by ADF

### Initial concerns:

- allocation and management of time by the club contact for working on the program
- some resistance and concern from 'smoking' members
- a culture of 'drinking'
- alcohol revenue and turnover
- extra demands on voluntary staff.

### Easily achievable aspects:

- training in the responsible serving of alcohol (well organised and very beneficial)
- compliance with liquor licensing laws
- smoke-free club change rooms.

### Challenging aspects:

- transport strategies in remote areas
- changing the mind-set of some players regarding binge drinking (e.g.; 'end-of-season wakes')
- providing food where cooking and kitchen facilities are limited.

The program has been adopted by a diverse range of community sporting clubs. To date, Good Sports clubs include cycling, athletics, angling, martial arts, motor sports, dog training, shooting, go-karting, bocce, callisthenics, croquet, darts, golf, grid-iron, gymnastics, hockey, horse racing, lacrosse, martial arts, pony club, rowing, sailing, sky diving, soccer, softball, squash, swimming, table tennis, ten-pin bowling, volleyball, yachting, baseball, as well as the more popular sports of Australian rules football, rugby, lawn bowls, cricket, golf, tennis, and surf lifesaving.

# Kids the big winner in International Cricket this summer

Cheaper admission and themed events will see kids and families as the big winners in International Cricket in Melbourne this summer with tickets going on sale today.

Australia host South Africa in the 3 mobile Boxing Day Test on the MCG, the only game to be played on the hallowed turf in 2005/2006, and do battle with South Africa and Sri Lanka in the VB One Day series at Telstra Dome.

In a move to attract kids and families, children under 16 will be admitted to international cricket for just \$5.00, a significant reduction on last season's price of \$20.00. A feature of the 3 mobile Boxing Day Test will be a Ladies Day theme on day two and a Family Day on day three. One FREE children's General Admission ticket will be provided with every Adult GA ticket purchased for day three.

In launching Melbourne's ticketing for the 2005/06 cricket season, Cricket Victoria CEO Ken Jacobs said the ticketing schedule reflected the organisation's vision for cricket. "Cricket Victoria wants cricket to be accessible and aspirational for everyone in the community. By reducing children's tickets to \$5.00 and also incorporating a free kid's day on day three, we are actively opening international cricket back up to much greater numbers of kids and families".

Jacobs also stated Cricket Victoria's vision for the Boxing Day Test. "Simply, we have a vision to position the Boxing Day Test Match as Melbourne's favourite event. We are introducing a series of new initiatives such as themed days and activity precinct areas among many other promotions, to create a unique event experience that appeals to all demographics".
