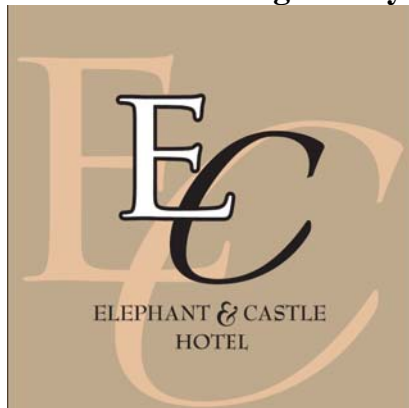

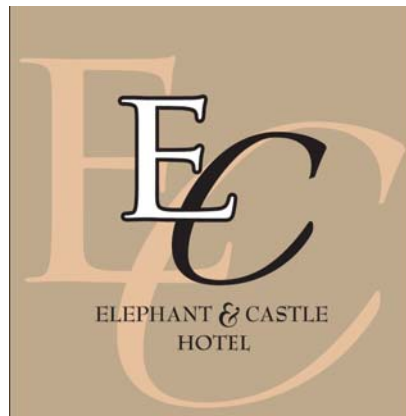

Vale Geoff Lindsay Burch

Geoff Burch played 48 First XI matches with Newtown & Chilwell between 1948 and 1955. Geoff was a member of the 1948/49 premiership team as an opening bowler. He took 73 wickets at 19.32 made 441 runs at 12.97 and claimed a useful 27 catches in a distinguished career.

Geoff Burch passed away on Boxing Day. His funeral at Eltham was attended by good friends Chris and Anna Carroll.

Vale Barry Dennis Flanagan

Barry Flanagan passed away on January 10 after a battle with cancer aged 53 years

Barry was one of the true club characters in his two stints at the club which included the halcyon days of the Platinum Era.

Bazza was one of 24 players to have played in all six club senior elevens, playing 170 matches and amassing 5082 runs at the super average of 31.96 per innings with his hard hitting batting.

A talented baseballer he was able to despatch attacks at will and his 14 half centuries and four centuries included a whirlwind 149 on club debut in the Fifts in season 1974/75.

Barry was a talented allrounder claiming 98 wickets at 20.34 including 8/11 in the Thirds and snared 88 catches, some as wicketkeeper in various grades including the Seconds.

A four time premiership player, one Fourth and three with the Fifts, he was a long time staff member of Victoria University's IT department.

His funeral will be held at St Brendans, Wellington Street, Flemington at 11 am on Thursday, January 12th.

Barry Flanagan is survived by his wife Sandra and daughter Gemma.

TURNING NEGATIVES INTO POSITIVES

Like it or not negative thoughts are a part of the game, everyone has them!

No one will hand you 5 wickets or 100 runs on a plate. It is natural to have negative thoughts from time to time and you will need to learn to deal with these to overcome the adversity you face from external challenges, such as competitors and conditions, and from internal challenges i.e. your own thoughts.

A critical mental skill is to be able to turn your negative thoughts into positive thoughts.

Negative thoughts aren't all bad as they help to make us aware of the things that can go wrong in a performance and tell us that our performance is important to us, making us aware of the consequences of failure. However, in order to be the best you can be, you will need to manage your thinking. If negative thoughts take control of you they can become overwhelming and lead to you being defeated before you even get into the contest!

An important thing to realise is that you control your thinking and that your thinking does not control you! You need to take responsibility for your thinking including managing and controlling your negative thoughts.

By turning a negative thought around into a positive one you can turn an obstacle into an opportunity. Ask yourself 'What is the opportunity here?' For example, if you are concerned that you will perform poorly due to a recent run of poor form, instead of being resigned to another failure, look for an opportunity. A batsman faced with a wicket where the ball bounces and moves, assisting the fast bowlers may be worried about nicking the ball, an opportunity here would be to use the bounce and movement the wicket offers the bowlers to leave the ball alone and frustrate the bowlers into bowling to you in your scoring areas. A bowler may be worried that he won't get a wicket because the pitch is very flat and offering no bounce or movement, is an opportunity to bowl the best line and length of your life and to see how well you go in tough conditions.

Next time you get a negative thought will you let it control and eventually erode your performance or will you take control and seize the opportunity it presents?

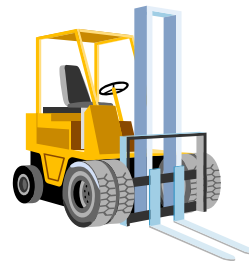

That's entertainment

Nightclub king Stewie Harrison's first single hits the record shops this week. He talks excitedly to *Cam Ward* about his latest venture

All that glitters is not gold with Stewie Harrison – but it just might be soon. The Geelong nightclub king could soon become known for something other than his five-carat smile if his latest project takes off.

"Disco" Stewie Harrison has just released his first single, a cover version of the Eric Carmen-penned *I Need You* that was a hit for Michael Jackson's nephews, 3T, in the mid-Nineties.

Helping Stewie carry the load vocally is Roma Waterman, acclaimed singer-songwriter and founder of the Melbourne Gospel Choir (which also makes an appearance on the song).

Four years in the planning, the song is the ultimate extension of Stewie's love of the entertainment industry.

"I've been in the most exciting business in the world and it's called entertainment," he says.

"The culmination of anything in entertainment is to sing and have a record.

"I believe the most powerful medium in the world is music."

A dance song was a natural choice for the man who credits the release of *Saturday Night Fever* in 1977 as the turning point for his industry and the defining moment in his career. It came just two years after Stewie left the family wheat and sheep farm in Donald bound for Melbourne in an old HQ Holden with \$300 in his pocket.

The irresistible combination of John Travolta, that white suit and the Bee Gees' soundtrack inspired Stewie to leave his hotel hospitality job to run discos attached to hotels all over Melbourne and, eventually, Australia-wide.

More recently, watching shows like *Australian Idol* and *The X-Factor* made Stewie realise that even non-singers could get the chance to cut their own record.

He wanted to do a "light-hearted dance song with a message" and came across *I Need You*, recorded by Taj, Taryll, and Tito Joe Jackson in 1995 with a little help from their uncle Mike on backing vocals.

Not that Stewie let Roma carry the load solely on his version of *I Need You*. Prior to stepping into the recording studio a little over 12 months ago, Stewie sought out local songstress and singing teacher Angie Hilton for a few lessons.

Even so, he likened getting behind the microphone for the very first time to "starting as first ruck in a Grand Final".

The song took four days to lay down in the studio with the help of producer Adrian Hannan and Stewie describes the whole experience as "terrific fun".

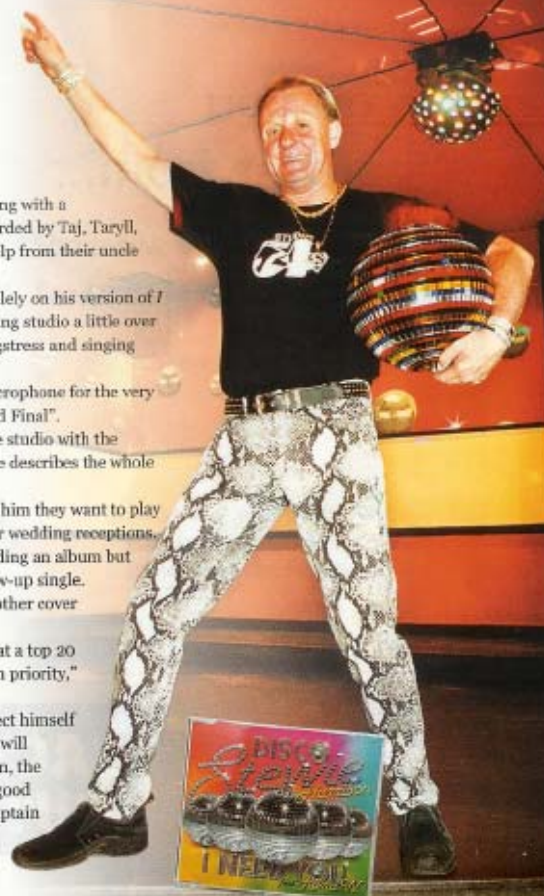
He says that two people have already told him they want to play the "love mix" version of *I Need You* at their wedding receptions.

Stewie has ruled out any thought of recording an album but concedes the temptation is there for a follow-up single. And he's already mulling over the song, another cover version.

"What I'd like to do is have a decent shot at a top 20 single, even for a week. But it's not my main priority," he says.

Stewie funded the whole *I Need You* project himself but says a "significant amount" of the sales will be donated to the Trevor Barker Foundation, the organisation set up in memory of Stewie's good friend and former St Kilda Football Club captain who died of cancer in 1996.
