Barry Flanagan Tribute.....by Dale Pearce (23rd N&CCC Life Member)

It was with great sadness this week that I received news via the club of the passing of Barry Flanagan.

As the obituary notice indicated, Barry was a great contributor to the Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club. Statistics aside, he was a bloke you wanted in your side. Technically sound with the bat, he was blessed with a wonderful eye, great timing and was as clean a hitter of the ball as you would wish to see when in full stride. All that baseball in his younger days, I suspect. If the side was 3/70 after 40 overs then he could change the tempo of the innings and the course of the match in 30 minutes. He might miss out, but he was more than likely to give you a quick 40. Barry didn't care much about averages.

Barry would do whatever was asked of him by the skipper. He could open the bowling at a pinch, give you a few overs of outswing while the shine was still there in the middle of the innings or deliver offies to great effect. He could keep wickets, had a good pair of hands in slips and a great, flat arm (baseball again).

Beyond all that, Barry was a great club man. Need someone to man the bar, roll the wicket, clean up the rooms, sell raffle tickets or help with a fund raiser? Barry would do it. When he left Geelong he continued to travel back on weekends to play, motoring along in the yellow Sigma wagon filled with empty cans of Coke, assorted rubbish and cigarette smoke. The latter, of course, was a vice Barry had trouble kicking for a long while.

Barry suffered from poor health during his final years with the club. It didn't seem much to dampen his enthusiasm for the game or for the club and he was very calm and philosophical about his illnesses, as he was with most things in life. At the end I am sure he would have been thinking more of those around him than his own condition.

Barry was highly intelligent, had a great sense of humour and had travelled extensively, including Asia and the Middle East in times when those locations were not on the tourist map. I was last in contact with him two years ago when I tried to persuade him to attend the President's Dinner, but he wasn't able to attend. It's a pity recent players never had the opportunity to meet one of the club's real characters. He was universally liked by his team mates and opponents.

My abiding memory of Barry Flanagan will be of him on the back foot, creaming a ball only marginally short of a length over mid wicket. He was a great cricketer, a great club member and a great bloke.

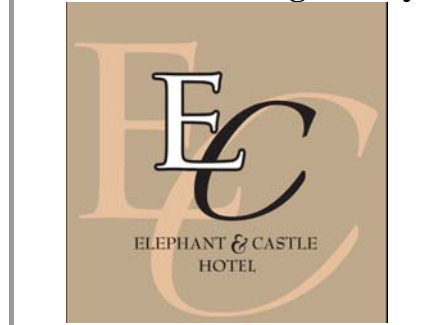
