A consistent batting display by East Belmont has left their match with Newtown & Chilwell at Winter Reserve evenly balanced.

Beau Carroll, Matthew Lineker, Drew Allan and Grant Dew built the Lions total of 9-211 around solid contributions between 46 and 33. The Blues captain, Barry Tsitas would probably have been reasonably satisfied restricting their seven-day target to 212 and especially his own contribution to that end. The leg-spinner took the captain's prerogative with the new ball and sent down a marathon spell of 32 overs during which he claimed 6-81.

Newtown & Chilwell made it two home defeats in a row for reigning premier, East Belmont when they successfully chased the 212 they needed for victory at Winter Reserve.

It was a consistent batting performance by the Blues who had crucial half-century contributions from John Rees and Michael Kelson. Rees, Hayden Clarke and Aaron Croft had taken the visitors to 1-129, but Leigh and Drew Allan both bowled tight spells so that at 4-146 the game could have gone either way. Then Kelson and Simon Pearce added a match winning 87. Therefore the same team that lost at home to Leopold and St Peters has now downed East Belmont and Geelong City away.

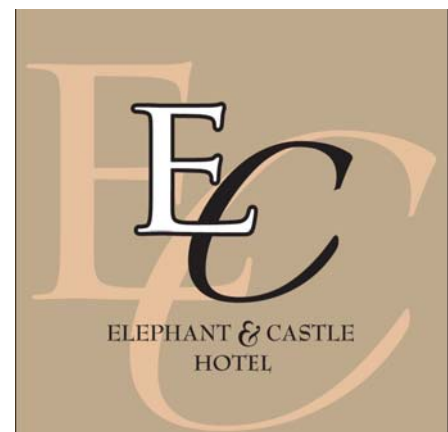
