Morning all,

Our committee meeting was held at the Elephant and Castle on Monday night, a couple of days earlier than usual because our rooms are unavailable to us during the refurbishment and there were also some pressing GCA meetings being held Tuesday and Wednesday.

So, time to bring you up to date with things again.

On members, firstly congratulations to Matt Suvoitos, then to all those blokes who got their memberships in on time, or made satisfactory arrangements to pay their memberships before the cut-off date.

This year we have greatly reduced the number of stragglers. We will be chasing these players up, otherwise they will not, under our new policy, play this weekend. Yep, we mean it!

If you are one of the people yet to sort out your membership, don't wait for Matt or Rhys to come to you, go looking for him. It is your responsibility as a Newtown and Chilwell cricketer to be financial.

We also discussed the need to reduce the qualification levels for averages this year due to the reduced number of games being played. This season, the new levels will be 6 games, 5 innings and 160 runs for batting and 6 games, 12 wickets and 40 overs for bowling.

On the refurbishment of our rooms, it's pretty obvious that it's underway.

We've entered into an agreement to use the Queens Park Golf Club facilities and it was great to see a whole bunch of people there on both Saturday and Sunday night, especially Sunday night celebrating the Firsts massive win over East Belmont.

Re the rest of the season, unfortunately despite us pushing to have a final six should there be a finals series, the GCA management has decided to opt for a final 4 due to water restrictions and the costs involved in getting a ground up for finals.

In other GCA news, the clubs on Wednesday night voted to support a motion from St Joseph's, Waurn Ponds and Torquay that they receive funding from the GCA for turf wicket maintenance.

This situation arose due to the stipulation by CoGG that those particular clubs were not to receive monies from the WMDA as they were not using CoGG grounds. After an extremely lengthy, and at times heated, debate, clubs were asked to vote on 3 possible outcomes... the one that got up, by a solitary vote, was to support all three clubs. What this means to us is that our affiliation fees will rise by approx \$350 each year.

Our stance was to support the management's recommendation to support St Joeys but not the other two. This was due to the fact both Torquay and Waurn Ponds (then University) both came into the competition under the clear understanding that there would be no money available to them for turf maintenance and also that neither pay ground rental. Torquay obviously also falls outside of the CoGG in the Surf Coast Shire.

There is no doubting it has been a difficult season, but that's not a reason to let our standards drop. Rather in adversity, we should be looking to improve the way we go about our game.

Which brings me to attendances at training. To say the least, they have been disappointing.

This is an issue our committee will be addressing in great detail during the off-season, that and how to treat those players who miss games.

We had a healthy discussion about how we might improve things next year to ensure players, particularly among the turf squads, are available for most of the season.

In the meantime, I can only implore you once again to get to training. As Jason Clark proved last weekend, it is the place where you do the hard work to achieve your goals.

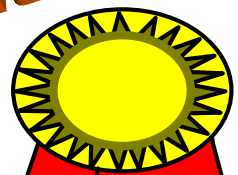

If nothing else, our First XI is providing entertaining, thrilling and fascinating finishes in its matches of late and Saturday's last ball epic was all of that.

In trying 37 degree heat matched only by the suffocating bushfire smoke and haze two evenly balanced teams fought out an epic battle. With both side's seasons hanging on a knife's edge South Barwon won the toss and with its upper order all enjoying the super batting conditions amassed 253 from their 48 match amended overs. Debutant Cam Russell returning the best figures of the embattled bowlers with 2/37 from eight overs.

After the break, an enterprising start by the home team stalled with three wickets falling in the thirties and it was up to Boof Pearce and Josh Hunt to fly the flag. That they did with a 103 run fourth wicket partnership putting the Two Blues back in control. Josh holed out after looking in complete control and Ben Neville joined Pearce and once again the Blues were looking good things at 5/194 on the fast outfield.

Quality players win games and up stepped Brad Hauenstein who removed the rampant Neville with a fine yorker and followed up quickly with Rhys Bennett's wicket. South Barwon back in front.

This amazing game then took another twist with the home side requiring 30 from three overs as Adam Lavars showed he has what it takes to succeed at this level compiling a fine 38 to nearly steal the match.

Hauenstein returned to bowl the final over setting an amazing 7-2 field with no leg side player behind mid wicket as he had employed earlier. Lavars managed to eek out two to square leg leaving the Blues needing two runs from the final ball. This week it was the bowler's turn to triumph as the ball beat the bat with keeper Breuer running down the stumps to ensure victory for the visitors.

Again a fascinating match but unfortunately not the result the Two Blues needed.

Turf boost for clubs

THREE clubs will receive funding from the Geelong Cricket Association for turf wicket maintenance after clubs narrowly approved the motion this week.

Torquay, Waurn Ponds and St Joseph's will each receive \$2500 after clubs voted to self-fund their maintenance allowance on Wednesday.

The three clubs, who do not use City of Greater Geelong grounds, previously received \$2500 of council-funded money, while all other clubs got \$6000. But under the new wicket management and development agreement, City Hall indicated the three clubs were not to receive any money.

Allowing those clubs to receive council money would have put the new agreement under threat, forcing clubs to consider other alternatives, which were put to a vote this week.

The three options put to clubs at the meeting on Wednesday night were to provide money to all three clubs, to support only St Joseph's, or to support none. The option to support only St Joseph's came about because Torquay and Waurn Ponds (then University) entered the competition under the agreement they would not receive money for turf maintenance, and also because neither pays ground rental fees.

Some clubs also believe Torquay should not be entitled to any City of Greater Geelong money because it falls within the Surf Coast Shire and should try to get funding from that council instead.

Each club is expected to pay about \$350 extra in affiliation fees to support the fund.

St Joseph's president Ken Gannon yesterday said his club was very thankful for the support of other clubs in allowing the motion to be passed.

2006 Boxing Day Test ICC Equipment Drive

ICC East Asia-Pacific (EAP) in conjunction with the Melbourne Cricket Club (MCC) and Cricket Victoria have organised a used Cricket Equipment Drive during the MCG Boxing Day Test. The equipment drive will help give someone the opportunity to play cricket in places like Fiji. A

collection bin will be located on the grassed area adjacent to Gate 6 on Days 1, 2 & 3.

The growth of cricket within the ICC EAP regional countries has reached enormous proportions in recent years. Over 35,000 people now play cricket in the EAP region, compared with approximately 15,000 in the year 2002.

The inaugural equipment drive, held during the 2004 Boxing Day Test, saw over 500 items donated (including old bats, balls, pads and gloves etc.) which were distributed to budding cricketers in PNG, Fiji, Japan, Indonesia, South Korea, Philippines, Vanuatu, Samoa, Tonga and Cook Islands.
