



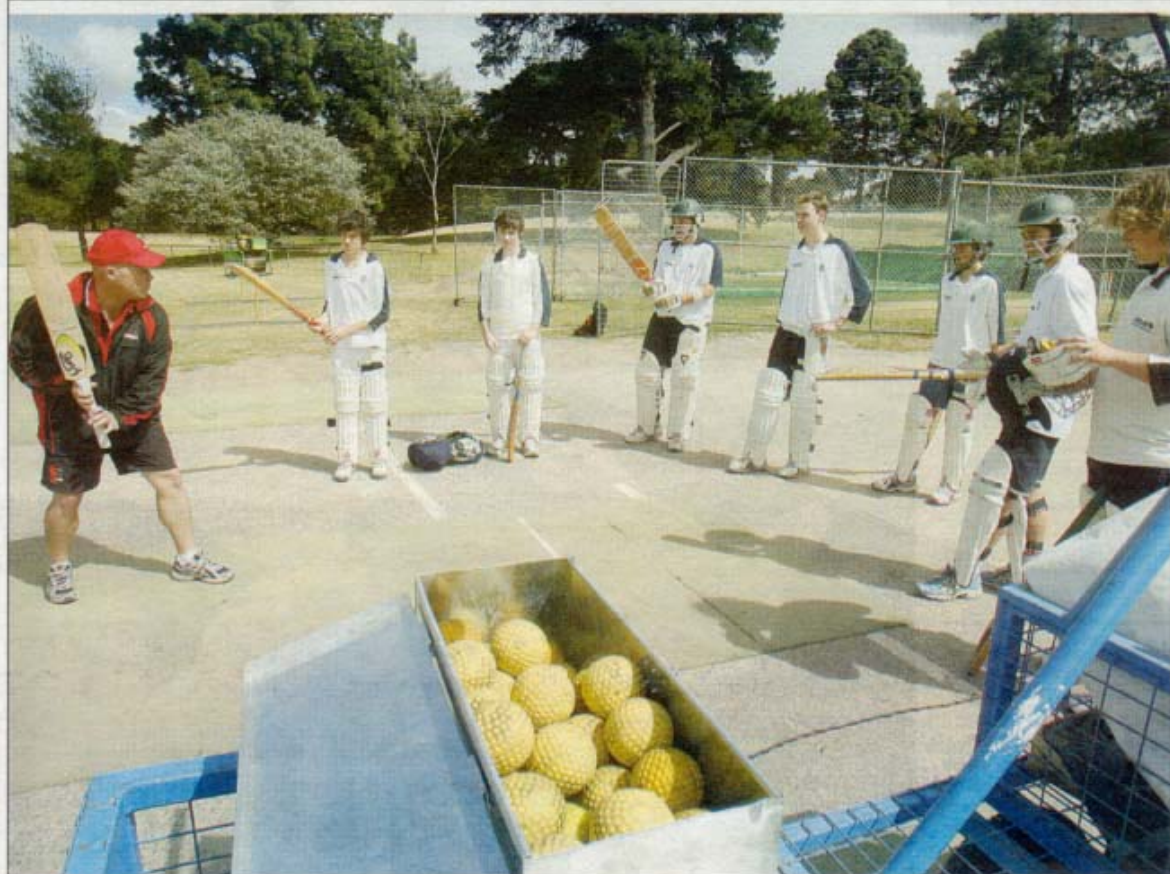

## Having a play strategy is key, says coach

HAVING a hit in the nets is one thing, batting with a strategy is another.

Rather than rely solely on instincts, all run-makers should have a plan at the crease.

As former Australia A wicket-keeper Mark Atkinson explained to about 40 junior and senior Newtown players on Sunday, the difference between getting starts and making runs is often application.

As part of a one-off coaching clinic on Sunday, Atkinson introduced the Two Blues' up-and-comers to a range of revolutionary cricket training

methods making waves in New South Wales.

Focusing on run-making strategy, shot selection and situation analysis, Atkinson incorporated the use of high-tech video analysis to assist players' batting and bowling technique for a full day at Queens Park.

"We went inside and watched the bowlers' replays in slow motion on a laptop and compared them to footage of blokes like Brett Lee and Glenn McGrath to pick out ways to improve," said Newtown first XI batsman Rhys Bennett.

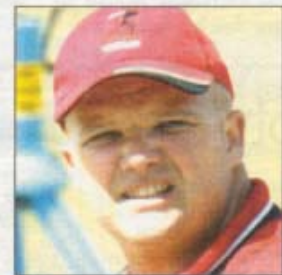
"He talked about how open-

ing bowlers probably don't make opening batsmen play enough by giving them too many balls to leave, so he encouraged bowling more at the stumps with more of a 5-4 field rather than 7-2.

"And the batsmen batted in pairs in the nets and worked on different strategies, like how to open and playing down the right line of the ball rather than just feathering at it. Basically, batting in the right mindset.

"It was very good, particularly for all the juniors in the morning who thought it was awesome."

It's hoped the coaching

clinic, thanks to Transport Finance, will become an annual event.

Atkinson currently coaches Balmain in Sydney first-grade.

Last Sunday we held the inaugural Transport Finance Home Loans Elite Cricket Coaching Clinic at Queen's Park.

Firstly, I want to congratulate and thank **Brett Bentley** and **Chris Hocking** from **Transport Finance Home Loans** for allowing this ground breaking and highly worthwhile event to take place. Without their assistance, this would never have been possible.

Secondly, thanks to all the guys who turned up - both elite juniors and senior turf players. I don't think anyone left without learning a great deal about the game of cricket.

The Coaches, Mark Atkinson and Ben Sawyer, provided a rare insight into the sciences of the game.

From a personal view, it was fantastic to have my run-up videoed, and then run through it with Ben, who is himself an accomplished opening bowler in Sydney grade cricket. With his background as a bio-mechanist, he was able to put out things that can reduce the impact of bowling on your body and also help you bowl better.

I learned you're never too old to learn.

Something else I really want to acknowledge is the conduct of our young blokes who not only really got into the clinic for the juniors in the mornings, but took the time to go and personally thank both Mark and Ben.

Not only do we have good young cricketers coming through, we have well-mannered ones.

Mark Atkinson left Queen's Park highly impressed with our club and keen to come again and we are keen to have him again because he showed in a very short time many of the things we can do to improve the way we play the game of cricket. The onus is now on us to implement them.

I know some of our promising bowlers went straight back to the nets after the video analysis of their actions and not only immediately made the suggested changes, but felt a positive impact.

As Ben pointed out, other changes take time to feel natural. But the more you do them in the nets, the easier it will be.

If you weren't there on Sunday, feel free to talk to someone who was about the things they learnt. The videos and photos from the day are now on-line in the photos section of the website so feel free to have a browse. That way, the players who did attend, and who did get advice and ideas on how to improve, can go back to it from time to time to reflect on what advice Mark and Ben gave you.

Mark also made it clear he is happy to answer queries via e-mail, so if something is not quite working out, let us know and we will get in contact with him.

As I said, it is something that we plan to do again next summer - a great project as we continue our policy of constant improvement at N&CCC.

Good luck for the season ahead and remember as Mark said "Cricket is a very simple game and if we concentrate on doing those simple things to the best we can, the results will come."
