Panthers tough under pressure

BELL Post Hill overcame rain interruptions, an under-prepared wicket and a top order collapse to put itself in a sound position against Newtown & Chilwell on Saturday.

The Panthers' captain-coach Brad Stacey resurrected his side from a precarious 6-84 with an invaluable 86 not out to leave Bell Post Hill on a competitive 9-241 from the 81 overs the weather allowed at Myers Reserve.

"We were on top until tea," Newtown & Chilwell captain-coach Barry Tsitas said. "We were sitting pretty, really. But we dropped an important catch, bowled some poor lines after the break and then Stacey batted really well."

Tsitas won the toss and sent the home side in to bat.

The wicket was underdone after Bell Post Hill had problems with its preparation during the week.

Initially the ring road roadworks had ruptured a water main so the cricket club could not get water on the square. Then Friday and Saturday morning showers left the pitch soft at the start of play.

Scott Mullen dismissed Tim Sells in the third over, holding a leading edge off his own bowling, to give the Blues an almost instant advantage.

Tsitas, bowling into the wind, got slow turn form the surface and with Michael Coode worked through the top order despite some resistance from Darren Kiddle.

Stacey's, response though was decisive. He and John Boljkovac added 92 for the seventh wicket to wrest the initiative away from the visitors.

"I had told my guys that Bell Post Hill bat right down and that we couldn't relax," Tsitas said. "Any side that has Michael Lymer coming in at No.10 requires an all out effort and maybe we became a little complacent."

"Anything short sat up and Stacey just put away the bad balls. Boljkovac took us on more and got away with it. If you batted for survival you wouldn't last so their approach was the right one."

"They had the momentum at the close and on their home ground would expect to win. But I would definitely back our guys to get 242 next week. They are all in good nick as was shown by our chase against Thomson where everyone got a score. So there is no reason why we can't reach that target."

Unfortunately early wickets put the Two Blues behind the 8 ball and at 4 for 29 the home side was well on top.

Solid as a rock John Rees with 65 rebuilt his team's confidence adding 67 with Simon Pearce (33) before the mounting pressure became evident on the away side. Late runs by newcomer Michael Coode with an impressive 41 not out gave the Blues respectability.

Clinic a big winner

WE take pretty seriously the job of producing better and better cricketers at Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club.

Thanks to our junior development organiser, Mark Turnley, we have a brilliant junior program this year, the talking point our ability to put three Under-17 teams on the park.

On Sunday, October 15, we made sure the best of the young blokes had access to the best coaching expertise we could find.

While Ben was working with the bowling, Mark Atkinson was providing tips to the batsmen. Older blokes watching on nodded in agreement with what Ben and Mark had to say and could barely wait for their clinic to begin in the afternoon.

The pair ran their knowing eyes over the pick of our senior turf players.

Again, small but vital adjustments to technique produced immediate results.

It was all a marvellous lesson is just how much

DARWIN AWARDS 2006. In case you haven't received them yet, here are this year's Darwin Awards -- the annual honour given to the person who improved the "gene pool" the most by killing themselves in the most extraordinarily stupid way. As always, competition this year has been keen. And the candidates this year are.....

MICHIGAN... In Detroit, a 41-year-old man got stuck and drowned in two feet of water after squeezing head first through an 18-inch-wide sewer grate to retrieve his car keys.

CALIFORNIA...

A 49-year-old San Francisco stockbroker, who "totally zoned when he ran," -- accidentally jogged off a 100-foot-high cliff on his daily run.

NORTH CAROLINA...

Buxton, NC: A man died on a beach when an 8-foot-deep hole he had dug into the sand caved in as he sat inside it. Beach-goers said Daniel Jones, 21, dug the hole for fun, or protection from the wind, and had been sitting in a beach chair at the bottom Thursday afternoon when it collapsed, burying him beneath 5 feet of sand.

People on the beach on the outer banks, used their hands and shovels, trying to claw their way to Jones, a resident of Woodbridge, VA, but could not reach him. It took rescue workers using heavy equipment almost an hour to free him while about 200 people looked on. Jones was pronounced dead at a hospital.

CALIFORNIA...

Santiago Alvarado, 24, was killed in Lompoc, CA, as he fell face-first through the ceiling of a bicycle shop he was burglarizing. Death was caused when the long flashlight he had placed in his mouth (to keep his hands free) rammed into the base of his skull as he hit the floor.

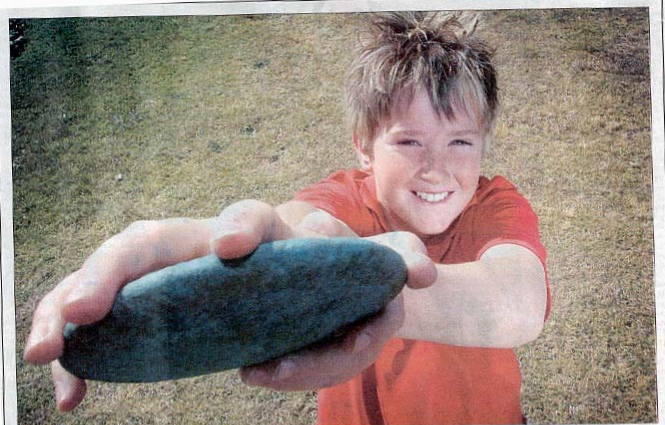
