## FIRSTS

### In Lost to North Geelong at Osborne Park

North Geelong retained the Charlie Pearce/Dennis Hynes Trophy in a thrilling game at Osborne Park.

In a match that ebbed and flowed as both teams took the initiative and then surrendered it, the home side held sway as the Two Blues looked certain to take the points.

Cruising at 5 for 194 chasing 214 the Blues looked winners but the Magpies held their nerve and a series of run outs saw the home side get the points by just two runs.

North Geelong secured outright top position on the GCA Division One ladder with a thrilling two run win over Newtown & Chilwell in the Match of the Round at Osborne Park on Saturday. The Magpies remain the only unbeaten side in the competition due to Geelong City's narrow loss to Lara, but they were challenged all the way by the Blues. The visitors in fact got into a position to win the game, but three late run-outs at crucial times left them just short of their 215 run target.

The exciting climax was a fitting result for the eleventh contesting of the Charles Pearce/Denis Hynes Trophy which is awarded to the winner each year when these two sides meet.

"They panicked a bit and we got home," said a relieved North Geelong captain-coach, Brad Scown. "But in the end there were eleven blokes out there who really wanted to win and that was the most pleasing aspect for me."

Scown hadn't been so pleased when he lost the toss and his side was 4-45 after being sent in on a wicket that North Geelong main man, Roger Allen described as a 'belter'.

Shannon Gove took three of those four wickets, including both openers Ben Harmon and Sam Hall for ducks.

"I would have batted because the wicket has been excellent," Scown said. "But there was some poor shot selection and that got us into trouble."

It took more batting heroics from Andrew Fergusson and Alf Clark to resurrect the Magpie innings. Both scored half centuries, the veteran Clark going on to a superb 87 not out that included eleven fours and a six.

"Andrew and Alf are in a different class to everyone else," Scown said. "Ferg just

put the ball into the gaps while Alf is hitting the ball superbly. I'm told as well as at any time in his career. He's dropped down to number six and he really seems to be enjoying it there."

The inform pair added 60, but when Peter Kenyon joined Clark North Geelong were still in trouble at 7-143.

The busy wicketkeeper batsman pushed singles while Clark continued to play his shots and the eighth wicket pair added an invaluable 63 that took the Magpies final total to 8-214.

"That stand got us back into the match," Scown said. "But I still thought we were no more than 50-50 chance because of the wicket and the fast outfield. I believed that if they batted out their overs they would have got those runs."

John Rees and Tim Clarke gave the early Newtown & Chilwell batting some momentum, but wickets started falling and they slipped to 4-89. Then Simon Pearce and Geelong footballer, Josh Hunt came together to build what appeared to be a matchwinning partnership of 86 for the fifth wicket.

"We missed a couple of chances," Scown said. "And that can happen, but I was disappointed with our concentration and ground fielding as much as anything during that stand."

"We did send down fewer extras than their bowlers which was good. And from my point of view I was happy that I got the number of overs for the bowler's right. I was really worried that I would muck that up and have to use a part timer for the final overs in a close finish."

"When they need about forty with six wickets in hand I thought they would win even though they had used up a lot of overs"

A leading edge from a Cameron Alford slower ball then removed Pearce and gave North Geelong a lift.

Then came the run-outs. An easy one was turned into a suicidal two. As the tension built the substitute on for Alf Clark who had a strained hamstring also broke down. Finally Gove and Scott Mullen, stretched for an extra run, Fergusson fielding in the deep held his nerve with an accurate throw and in the second last over the Magpies had secured their six points.

"To be four wins and no losses in such an even competition is a great effort,"

Scown says. "And it was good to get the points when we had some ordinary patches in the game. But I have to say we've worked pretty hard so far, so it hasn't been left to chance."

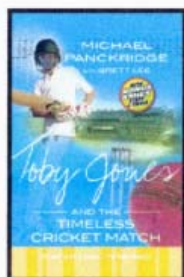
