## Competition Hit Hard by Water Restrictions

Despite the best efforts of the GCA management committee to salvage something from a bad situation, the vast majority of clubs were unwilling to give up two Sundays in the best interests of Geelong cricket and flatly refused to play Sunday cricket apart from the 1 day (Dec 3) already scheduled.

The recommendation put forward to clubs by management was that 1sts and 2nds would play one day games each Saturday and Sunday over the next 3 weekends which would see 12 of the scheduled 13 rounds completed by Christmas. Hard wicket would also have played one day fixtures but only on Saturdays which would have seen them play 9 rounds prior to Christmas.

A compromise we proposed was to only play 1<sup>st</sup> XI cricket on the Sundays as at least it would mean the premier competition still had some integrity and would help with player availability as clubs would only be fielding one side rather than two on Sundays.

However, it was to no avail as the general consensus of the clubs was that they were only prepared to play on the dates already fixtured and as a result, the season has been shortened even further. The top four grades will now play rounds as outlined below with the home sides being the 1sts and 3rds. 2nds and 4ths draws are, of course, reversed.

\*\* December 16 is dependant on getting exemption to water wickets from Barwon Water so may or may not go ahead.

The structure of finals, club championships, averages and qualifications is yet to be finalised but information will be posted here as it becomes available.

The 5ths and 6ths draws now need to be totally re-done and will be posted on the website as soon as they are available.

At this stage there is minimal change to junior fixtures however this may change as the CoGG declares grounds unfit for play.

# Masterclass: Precision

There are two levels at which you need to deliver precision in your performance as a cricketer one is the strategic level and one is the technical level.

The strategic level concerns the plan you have in place and deals with the selection of shot or delivery you make in a given situation. For example if a batsman chooses to defend a ball on the front foot which he thinks will miss the stumps he takes on the risk of being caught behind the wicket for a return of no runs as opposed to a batsman who leaves the same delivery and completely eliminates the risk.

The leave option makes more sense as it eliminates the risk of being out to a ball that could not be scored off. A more precise strategic alternative is to leave the ball. You will need to know your plan in terms of your strengths and weakness and previous performances and apply it to the conditions you are in and the opposition you face on the day. My basic batting strategy is to defend balls on the stumps and score from or leave the balls off the stumps.

At the technical level you need to be precise in your attention to detail regarding the key requirements of the task. For example when executing a defensive stroke when batting these factors will include the quality of your balance, full face contact, coverage of your stumps and soft hands.

I group the errors that players make into the strategic and technical categories. For example a batsman may make a mistake because he chooses the wrong shot to play to a given ball and in this case no amount of technical skill will fix this error, a player will need to be precise to ensure the right shot is played to the right ball and this comes from having a plan that works and applying it with consistency. An example of a technical error would be that a player selects the right shot to the ball and the technical side of the shot fails, perhaps due to poor balance or alignment such as non-full face contact.

To perform consistently you will need to apply your skills to the task at hand at both the strategic and technical levels, first to make the rights choice and then secondly to execute your option correctly. To achieve this level of precision my recommendations are;

Have a thorough knowledge of your game plan and technical skills and apply them with consistency.

Master your technical skills through hours of quality and focused practice.

Accept, relax and enjoy the challenge.

Next time you are watching the cricket on TV you might like to pick a top international player and see if you can work out their game plan. The very good players will be prepared for every option and execute their plan with technical precision consistently.

**A regular check-up**

Some studies have shown that regular blood donation can help prevent the build-up of iron in the body over time, reducing the strain this places on major organs including the heart. The benefits are thought to be most pronounced in middle-aged men and amongst people prone to **haemachromotosis**.
