Trio pass major milestones

Congratulations to three of our club's leaders who passed major milestones over the double header weekend.

Former President **Adam O'Connor** played his 200th game during round 8. Since making his senior debut in '87/88 Knackers has amassed 3502 runs at 20.97 with three centuries and 13 fifties. His success as a bowler now seems long ago but he also has snared 146 wickets at 21.40 with a best bowling of 8 for 45. Add 88 catches and strangely enough, two stumpings, and Adam O'Connor has proven to be a great contributor in his 200 matches.

Four time premierships player **Darren Fleet** made his 2000th run on Saturday with a nicely compiled 33 against Newcomb. Enjoying his tenth season at the club, Darren boasts a remarkable record making his 2005 runs at 20.67 with 3 tons and 3 fifties. Combine that with 157 wickets at a miserly 16.45 and a premierships strike rate of one every 28 games he has proven to be a match winner time and time again.

Scott Mullen's dismissal of Jamie McDonald on Sunday was his 100th wicket with the club. The remarkable win over East Belmont was also the Pres's 50th match making it a triple celebration. Scott averages 16.15 per wicket with a best bowling of 7 for 39 in those 50 matches which have yielded two Second XI flags.

An inspired cameo batting performance by dual First XI premiership star Ben Neville has seen the First XI to a remarkable victory against reigning premiers East Belmont.

On an unforgivingly fast dry ground at Winters Reserve the Ones toiled to hold the home side to 4 for 281 prior to taking on one of the greatest run chases in the club's history. With John Rees (77), skipper Barry Tsitas (34) and Simon Pearce (52) all firing the Two Blues looked well placed at 2/188 after 37 overs.

Wickets tumbled as Ben Neville playing his first game for the club in four seasons took to the wicket with those 13 overs remaining and plundered 74 not out of the last 95 runs of the innings. Six sixes and 3 fours saw him single handedly seal a magnificent victory with just 3 balls remaining on a ground "The Freak" has made his own with some magnificent batting over the years.
