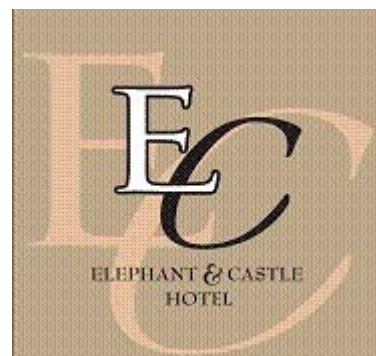

Chasing Torquay's 102 in the first innings, NCCC declared on 0-140.

Torquay made 109 when it batted again and NCCC polished that off, scoring 0-72.

The star was Paul Sheahan, not Geelong College's greatest cricketing export but a member of the Australian under-19 side some 20 years ago. He scored 108 not out in the first innings off just 45 balls.

UNCHARTERED WATERS:

When Darren Kiddle takes the field this Saturday at Myers Reserve against North Geelong, he will be playing his 256th and last match for Bell Post Hill, having been transferred to Ballarat in his employment. However the match will be statistically significant to him as he requires just one wicket and 20 runs to lift his career wickets to 500 and runs to 6000. No player in history has achieved this spectacular double with only two players reaching the 5000 run / 400 wicket double, being Bob Merriman and Noel Mullen.

Carey Oval at St. Josephs should be renamed "The Peoples Ground" after Jason Peoples explosive 304 no last Saturday for East-Belmont 3rds. Pounding 236 in boundaries with 18 sixes and 32 fours, his epic innings was the first ever triple century at all levels of GCA cricket. The only other known triple century anywhere in Geelong was by Norm Brown with 368no for Geelong West against Railways in the 1937-38 Geelong Senior Matting B grade competition grand final at Queens Park.

DREAM DEBUT:

Tim Clark's slick 51 on Country Week debut last week against Warnambool at Geelong Cricket Ground was the 19th.50 on debut since Geelong entered Country Week in 1930 and oddly, except for Neil Chapman with 65 against Dunmunkle in 1951 and Gordon McKay's 57 against Echuca in 1953, the remaining 17 batsmen to achieve the feat did so on the opening round of the Carnival. Of the 19, only three turned their 50's into debut hundreds, being Val Simpson with 137 against Dunmunkle in 1931, David Breheny with 125 no against Shepparton in 1975 and Max Kent with the even ton against Mildura in 1951.

Wicketkeeper Andre Borovec kept wickets as brilliantly as ever with five dismissals but for both he and Walerys, celebrations were put on hold as both made pairs, the only other batsman ever at Geelong with a pair to his name being Damien Koliba against Camberwell-Magpies in 2002-03 in a match Geelong won outright. During the match last round Aaron Finch passed 900 runs for the season, Clinton Peake 700 runs and Liam Buchanan 500 runs.
