## Oval grass gets green light

STINTON Oval at Queens Park has a new playing surface to protect it from the drought.

The traditional cool-season grasses have been replaced with a more durable and drought-resistant warm season grasses.

Geelong Mayor Bruce Harwood said the conversion was complete but would take some time to settle.

He said the football club would play on alternative grounds this coming season

while the warm-season grasses established themselves.

"Traditionally, the majority of these (sports grounds) have been sown to cool-season grasses, such as ryegrass, which flourish in the cooler months but require intensive irrigation in the warm months to keep them healthy and playable," Cr Harwood said.

"Warm-season grasses like couch and kikuyu are well adapted to hot, dry weather. They flourish in the warmer months and undergo a period of

dormancy during the cooler, winter months."

Cr Harwood said the drought impacted heavily on Geelong sporting clubs last year and 51 sportsgrounds with cool-season grasses were closed down because of safety concerns.

He said sportsgrounds sown to warm-season grasses, including Lara No.1 oval, Belmont Common and Barwon Heads, were in good condition without irrigation and were used as finals venues for local and state cricket competitions.

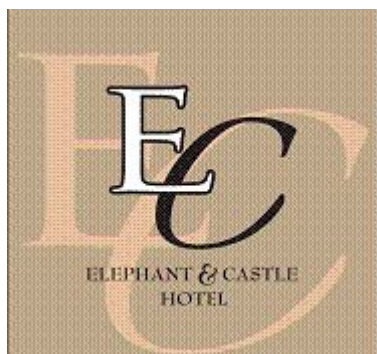
