Specs plays 300th match

FRIENDS, family and old teammates turned out at Grovedale Secondary College to honour the 300th appearance for Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club of Anthony 'Specs' Devlin last weekend.

Devlin has been a pillar of the club since making his debut in 1981-82 and has spread his 5481 runs across all grades except the first XI.

He has also taken 252 wickets and featured in four premierships.

"All clubs need a Tony Devlin." N&CCC president Scott Mullen said. "Specs is a real Trojan around the club and no matter what grade he's picked for, he always gives 120 per cent."

Devlin, who opened the bowling in last weekend's Fifts game and took a wicket, is five not out in the run chase at Grovedale.

He says N&CCC has played a huge part in his life.

"It is a club with a lot of good people in it and I have been lucky to have been able to learn a lot from them," he said. "I am grateful for all the opportunities that Newtown has given me."

Devlin was honoured in the club magazine, with former and current teammates prepared a list of anecdotes, including his denial of doing a runner from a well-known Geelong watering hole.

"I didn't run, I walked," Devlin is credited as saying.

Another story doing the rounds during the week has it that Devlin once explained away dropping at catch at Lara because "the You Yangs distracted me".

Many great names have been associated with Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club, not the least the Hassett brothers, sons of a Geelong real estate who had nine children.

A.L. Hassett, known as Lindsay, even the Puck in Flannels, had the most illustrious cricket career of all of them.



Even though his career was rudely interrupted by Mr Hitler, he still managed to play in 43 Tests, captaining Australia by the end of his career. He scored 3073 runs at 46.46, including 10 centuries.

In 1949, he was one of Wisden's Cricketers of the Year.

These are a few of his tips on how to play the game, culled from the History of the South Melbourne Cricket Club, for which he also played with great distinction. Apart from the way we do up our pads, probably not much has changed in a half century.

SOME RANDOM HINTS FROM LINDSAY HASSETT

See that your boots are sprigged sufficiently and that your gloves are not loose or worn;

All buckles of your pads should be carefully tucked in to avoid misunderstand should a ball flick one on its way through to the keeper;

Make a point of getting to the ground in time to have a practice hit before the game starts'

Before an innings try to sit in approximately the same light as you will find at the wickets;

On your way to the wickets adjust your eyes to changing distances by looking for a few seconds at objects far away, then near. If the ball is being thrown around by the fieldsmen then take a good look at that.

Avoid reading or concentrated observance of any particular item at close range before batting'

Every time you go into bat, practise memorising the field positions.

At the nets play your shots to definite positions to gain confidence in placing your shots;

Make a particular study of the bowler's grip for every ball. It is often possible to pick his intentions this way when you can't tell what is going to happen by his delivery.

Take every opportunity to practise your fielding - both ground fielding and catching. Fielding is as equally important as batting or bowling;

Don't forget your cricket during the winter. Get in front of a mirror - or failing that, play up and down any parallel lines'

See as much first-class cricket as you can. You will learn more by copying a good player than you will by reading about the game;

Always listen to good cricketers. There is always another helpful point to pick up;

But above all - head down, eye on the ball, and concentrate.

For Hadfield, it was a bit the same, if he didn't finally get around to recording these original songs, he might have missed out on something important in life.

Its a long story that starts when I wagged school in 1969, yeah the summer of, took \$30 out of my school bank account and, much to my fathers disappointment, bought this old second-hand guitar, my first real six-string, said Hadfield. It smelt of wine and cigarettes, a heady mix for a young bloke back then.

The plan was pretty simple - to become an overnight star, but a few things got in the way. All these years on and thanks to Mike, Ross and Pete, there is something to show for that an investment and I might be able to put the \$30 back.

In fact sales, after early airplay on ABC radio station around Australia, have already exceeded \$30.

We wont be retiring to the Bahamas but the response from around Australia has been very pleasant indeed, both in terms of praise, and also in orders, said Hadfield, who was also keen to heap praise on his fellow musicians involved in the project.

They say if a man can't be happy walking his dogs, he might never be happy. I think you can add making music with your mates to that list. This was a real team effort and it was really great fun.

The EP is released as a limited edition. I was wary of creating the most expensive coasters on the planet, said Hadfield wryly. So were starting with a small print run, and then seeing what happens.
