Kevin O'DOWD SPEAKS

HATS OFF TO KELLY:

Hats off to the Geelong Cricket Club. David Kelly and his committee deserve hearty congratulations on the superbly organised twin functions held in the Fred Flanagan Room at Kardinia Park last Saturday evening and Sunday. The Gala Dinner celebrating 15 years of VCA / Premier Cricket was attended by 280 followers of the club with Guest Speaker, world renowned cricket journalist and commentator, Mike Coward. The World Cup was also present with most attendees seizing on the unique opportunity of being photographed holding the special piece of silverware. Sundays Luncheon was also well attended and preceded the official opening of the International Standard Turf Wicket Practice Facility. The brainchild of club president David Kelly who has masterminded the project with passion and vigour over the last 5 years, the facility was aptly named the David Kelly Training Centre. One of the reasons for its creation was to once again attract International cricket to Kardinia Park, with a drop-in wicket. Without such training facilities, Cricket Australia cannot fixture Touring teams to Geelong. Ironically, the last International match at Kardinia Park was 25 years ago almost to the day when on 7th. January, 1983, the Geelong side of Michael Bowtell (c), Craig Scott, George Mirovich, Peter Caulfield, Len Barnett, Chris Lynch, Peter Oxlade, Terry Bright, Mark Seeckts and Glenn Ward hosted New Zealand, its near Test strength side including Geoff Howarth, Glenn Turner, John Wright, Jeff Crowe, Jeremy Coney, Richard Hadlee, Lance Cairns and Martin Snedden. Geelong's 5/193 was competitive until the Richard Hadlee show commenced, the star all-rounder smashing 117 to lift the Kiwis to 292.

WOEFUL 23:

The Torquay lads will be hitting the training track with intensity this week following its woeful effort against Geelong City last Saturday where all batsmen failed to reach double figures to be slaughtered for 23 courtesy of Travis Agg's 6/7, its previous lowest being 78 against East-Belmont in 2004-05. Its 23 is the eighth lowest completed GCA 1st XI team score of all-time, the last 23 scored by Newtown & Chilwell in 1945-46 against International Harvester. The lowest score of all-time is 10 by Geelong A against Geelong B in 1906-07 when Geelong A batted with just 6 men, the other five arriving at Corio Oval too late after their horse and cart broke a wheel on route to the ground. Although 10 is technically the record low, the lowest score where all 10 batsmen were actually dismissed is 13 scored by the crack GWC&FC team which included GCA Legends Jack Sing & Frank Pike, Newtown & Chilwell's Bruce Bartle the destroyer with 8/2 on this same round 49 years ago in season 1958-59.

GIVE ME 7:

Many years ago, Murray's Menswear (Beak's Family) in Moorabool Street donated a brand new cricket ball to the club of all players to capture 7 wickets in an innings. If this quaint gesture continued today it would be slim pickings indeed for club Treasurers. Seven 1st XI bowlers have snared six wickets in an innings this season, being Danny Hughes (6/6 and lost !), Travis Agg (6/7), Brendan Sleeman (6/14), Tim Marshall (6/22), Grant Dew (6/27), Barry Tsitas (6/27) and Clinton Ford (6/37). Since 1896, an average of 4.5 hauls of seven wickets in an innings have been registered per season. This season to date and last season no-one achieved the feat and in only three other seasons of 1898-99, 1934-35 and 1994-95 has the season been devoid of a single seven wicket haul. The most number of seven wicket hauls in a season is 13 in 1956-57 when South Barwon's Test Cricketer to-be in Alan Connolly achieved the feat on three occasions with 9/45 on debut against Geelong City followed by 7/29 against Newtown & Chilwell and 7/33 including a hat-trick against GWC&FC.

Good morning, or as Richie would say, "welcome back"!

This will be the first time since the refurbishment, since the sowing of the drought proof grass, since the arrival of the sight screens, that we can play or watch cricket on what we know to be the best cricket ground in our competition.

I want to invite all former players, life members, sponsors, supporters, etc, to come down on that day and enjoy this magical facility.

Again, thanks to the City of Greater Geelong, especially the Mayor, Bruce Harwood and Councillor Shane Dowling, but also CoGG staff, for their efforts in helping us with the refurbishment.

Also thanks to Chris Broad and the Geelong Amateur Football and Netball Club for their involvement in the partnership.

Speaking of the sight screens, our thanks go to the sponsors who made them possible, Glynn Harvey of Harvey's of Highton and Neville Crane, and most certainly to Arthur Fleet for his Herculean efforts in constructing them.

We have sent a letter to Artie to say thank you, but an informal thanks from members next time you see him would certainly not be out of place.

The sight screens are a symbol of the way our club is choosing to go forward, to set new standards and most importantly to provide our players with the best possible facilities and opportunities.

We have more to come in this regard and judging by the response to a few of our initiatives now, what we are doing is being noticed outside our club, and just occasionally with a little envy.

Other important social events to put into your diary are:

February 16th - President's Dinner.

February 24 - Major raffle.

April 4th - Presentation Night.

President's Dinner will be on the day of Jaik Mickleburgh's last game for our club, so come along that night to say goodbye to a bloke who has proven to be a great asset in a, sadly, too short a time. There will also be other special guests to ensure a lively evening.

Re the Presentation Night, I cannot stress how important it is for everyone to do everything possible to be there that night. It is going to be a Laxman, as in a V.V.S, Very Very Special night, for our club. You will kick yourself if you miss it, I can assure you.

We have also written to North Geelong legend Alf Clark, to congratulate him on his 250th 1st XI game. We were very interested to read his comments on the format of the GCA competition in the local paper. As some of you know, we have been formulating our own views on this via a discussion paper.

Congratulations to all the junior cricketers from N&CCC who have been playing in various representative competitions over January.

I am pleased to report that in a tough year, our club remains in reasonably good shape financially. We have spent a considerable amount on capital works this year, so a good second half of the financial year is crucial.

In this regard, this week we will be moving to round up those people who have yet to finalise their membership fees for 2007/2008. Accordingly a number of regular non-payers have now been ear-marked as not to be picked again by our club.

Finally, while we are only half way through the cricket season, we need to be thinking about our next annual general meeting, and office bearers for season 2008/2009. The committee has worked tirelessly this year to provide opportunities for players both young and old. Some of those people have already indicated they will be moving on.

As part of a proper succession planning policy we need to be thinking about their replacements now so that any transition is as smooth as possible. If you would like to be on the committee, let me know as there are some crucial roles that need to be filled.

Generally, our club is running pretty smoothly but we are not resting on our laurels. There is plenty of fine tuning to be done, both on and off the field.

Please, feel free to be part of the whole process in whatever way you can.

PEOPLE driving along Queens Park Road might find there's now a giant obstacle blocking their view of the cricket on Stinton Oval.

Newtown & Chilwell Cricket Club will become the first club in the GCA to use two giant mobile sightscreens in matches.

Towners' president Scott Mullen said the club would not have the two sightscreens had it not been for the generosity of their sponsors and supporters.

"Glynn Harvey, from Harvey's of Highton, jumped at the idea when we asked him for his support and (club life member) Neville Crane, one of our life members, also chipped in on a project that we believe puts our picturesque ground at Stinton Oval into a new league," Mullen said.

"I guess though the major contribution came from Arthur Fleet, the father of our first XI captain, Darren. We mentioned to him we were keen to have sightscreens this summer and that's all the encouragement he needed.

"We gave him a rough diagram of what we wanted, he obtained all the raw materials, then put together the sightscreens himself and, most wonderfully, without charging the club for his labours."

The screens will be used for the first time next weekend when Newtown plays East Belmont.

Mullen said the club, City of Greater Geelong and the Geelong Amateur Football Club worked together to ensure Stinton Oval was a high-standard facility.

Intro 2 Cricket Coaching Course
