EAST Belmont warmed up for its finals campaign with an efficient demolition of Newtown & Chilwell at Queens Park on Saturday.

The Lions prevailed by the huge margin of 307 runs and at one stage looked a genuine chance to win outright. It sent a warning to their fellow finalists while emphasising the large gap between those who are playing on and the teams whose seasons finished on Saturday.

For the Blues being bowled out for 67 was a sorry end to a poor season, even though they put in a better effort in the second innings.

East Belmont captain-coach Peter Quick took the new ball and turned back the clock with a fiery burst that seemed to unsettle the home side.

"There hadn't been much sun during the week so the pitch was quite fast and bouncy early on," Quick said. "It was really coming through and that seemed to put the wind up them.

"The second ball of the day hit their best batsman, Alex Stanley, in the ribs and apparently that created a bit of chat from the guys padded up. Plus we held our catches behind the wicket. Shaun Hooley and wicketkeeper Mark Hanley each took five for the day. So we got on a roll.

"I've rotated who has taken the new ball during the season to see what might be the best option for the finals. In the last couple of games I've taken it. It means I can have three spells rather than two if I come on later and that seems to be working for us at the moment."

After Quick and Leigh Allan created havoc with the new ball Sam Scannell demolished the middle and lower order taking a remarkable 4-4.

"Sam had a great all-round match," Quick said. "He made a hundred when we batted and took those wickets. He hit Scott Mullen in the head and got other wickets."

The Two Blues were batting a second time before 3pm, but produced a better performance to avoid an outright loss.
