CRANE CUP STAYS AT QUEEN'S PARK

After a lean round for the proud Navy and Cambridge Blues against East Belmont, the club as a whole bounced back with passion to secure wins in 4 of the six games played on the weekend past, in the process retaining the "Crane Cup". This was a great result for the two blues given the histrionics of last season's encounter.

Undoubtedly with the words of EEE Belmont supposed legend Jack Caulfield of "We're pretty happy to be playing them (N&CCC) twice this season" ringing in our collective ears, the club across all grades fought tooth and nail to return to the winners circle. I say to Caulfield and the uneducated prepubescent reporters from the Geelong Advertiser enjoy your time in the sun "boys" as on the horizon is a big ugly two blue cloud about to rain on your parade.

The firsts complied, on a GT belter, 263 on the back of Alex Stanley's 98, ably supported by Lavars (39), Sammy Eason (29) and Mikey (29). Honestly a good total however really should have capitalized and exceeded the 300 barrier. Day two and the hard work begun and who better to have in the trenches with you than the old war horses Mullen and Royce, both claimed 4 wickets apiece with B.P.H restricted to 216.

Dismissing the Hill for 108 (Loates & Del Rio 3 a piece), the run chase could not have started worse. Noodle dismissed first ball, leaving us overnight in a precarious position of 3 for 37. Day two, surprise surprise another "bell post hill belter", the boys struggled towards the total however a steady stream of wickets continued to fall, the application of the brothers Boyo putting on 40 for the 8th wicket almost got them over the line but unfortunately both fell in the same over to see the total short by 3 runs.

The 3s rolled the hill for 117 and just managed to get across the line with 127. Young Bully Bishop, who is more renowned for his ability with a mobile phone, the best with

the bat. The 4ths due mainly to the unimpressed Paul Sheehan (101) made 204; really with Paul smashing a ton realistically a total of somewhere near 300 would have been expected. This week we face South Barwon, should not need to say more there is no love lost here lets maintain momentum and send home with their tails between their legs. I believe there are a number of players unavailable this weekend so the rest of us need to step up.
