Glam rocker no one-hit wonder

GRANT Whiteside's teammates will have to deliver a glittering day two performance to ensure the Newtown and Chilwell veteran celebrates his 300th game with a win.

Day one of Whiteside's milestone match did not go according to plan, as the Two Blues fourths surrendered first innings points to South Barwon.

The 42-year-old made 17 in a disappointing total of 97. South Barwon ended the day on 7/108 but Whiteside believes his side still has a chance to press for a reverse outright.

"It's not quite the fairytale you'd want for your 300th but you never know what could happen this weekend," he said. Regardless of the result, Whiteside's standing as a club legend is unquestioned. The part-time glam rocker, who is the lead singer of '70s cover band The Glitter Gang, has played his entire career with Newtown and Chilwell.

He started as a 10-year-old with the Two Blues juniors in 1978/79 and progressed to senior ranks in 1982/83. Since then, the durable wicket keeper/batsman has taken a club record 285 catches and made four centuries, with a highest score of 162 in the fifths.

Whiteside has also played in four premierships, one in the thirds and three in the fifths. And he is far from finished. "I'm probably keeping better now than I did five or six years ago. The body is holding out pretty well, except on the really long days," he said.

"I figure that I'm feeling good about the keeping, so I reckon I can do that for a few more years and then just become a batsman and get seven or eight more years out of myself."





SOUTH Barwon cemented its place among an unbeaten group of four clubs with a huge percentage boosting 249-run win over Newtown and Chilwell in Saturday's round of GCA 1 cricket.

South Barwon remained in touch with East Belmont, St Joseph's and reigning premier Grovedale at the top of the table as it demonstrated the gulf between the top sides and the also-rans in the competition.

The Swans never allowed the Blues into the contest at any stage, bowling them out for just 143 in 52 overs, barely a third of the way to the huge target of 392 they had set.

Like all the sides with a total already on the board, the home side were assisted by the heavy rain on Friday that slowed the outfield, but more decisive was the great burst of fast bowling by big left-armer Brett Anderton.

"The wicket was rock hard," South Barwon captain-coach Brad Hauenstein said after Saturday's win.

"It had good bounce and carry and Brett used his pace, angles and the bounce to good effect. Even on a good wicket like that quality bowlers will find something with the new-ball."

Anderton had in-form Blues opener Alex Stanley caught behind by Simon Breuer in the first over of the day and quickly followed that with the scalp of his partner, Yves Rossety.

"Their number three Corey Mathieson and their English player Michael Comber tried to keep their innings going and put up some resistance," Hauenstein said. "We kept respecting the opposition, bowling to our plans and trying to keep the ball in the right areas, but obviously with 392 on the board you are confident of winning."

Anderton finished with the superb figures of 5-21 from 13.4 overs. His best support came from Hauenstein who finished with 2-20.

"I've been happy enough with the way the ball is coming out," Hauenstein said.

"But there have been plenty of dry flat batting pitches around this year and any wickets have been hard earned."

The South Barwon captain-coach is a stalwart of the club. He is in great form

with the bat and is enjoying the success the Swans are currently having.

"We were struggling to avoid relegation a few years ago. Now we have depth at the club and after last season we know we are good enough to compete with the other top teams. We defeated Newtown & Chilwell in all grades on Saturday and I can't remember that happening at South Barwon before," Hauenstein said.

Once again the Newtown 3rds bowling and fielding efforts were pleasing. Anthony Wilson used the new ball well and took two early wickets and left armer Jacob Simonson also took an early wicket. Sth Barwon then rode their luck for a while and on the back of one batsman having 'the day of his life' they were really able to put it to our boys. No backward steps from our bowlers though as Ainsworth, Pescott, Bates and Eastman were all keen to try and stem the flow of runs resulting from a lightning quick drought affected field and a sand paper pitch (worthy of a grand final again this season no doubt). Impressively Bates bowled 10 consecutive tight overs and Eastman reaped 3/34 from his increasing bowling work load. James Blight kept wicket beautifully and will be closely watched as our club tries to un-earth its next turf grade wicket-keeper. Sth Barwon set a challenging 253 for victory.

Our plan with the bat was simple. Bat disciplined to get to tea with as few wickets down as possible and then bat the 75 overs whilst accelerating the run rate accordingly. Our batsman did bat disciplined and we were 3/73 at break. Jeff Smith and Pezzie had taken the shine off the ball and Mark Ainsworth had compiled 30 before losing his wicket just before break. Pat Eastman was not out and looking good. After break we continued to be disciplined but the bowling proved too good. Eastman was the only recognised batsman after break to stand up.
