It is also pleasing to be able to tell the naysayers that the moneys spent on the upgrade aren't just for sporting users. A majority of the people who use Queens Park have no affiliation with either our club, Amateurs or the golf club. So a broad range of users will benefit from what will be an amazing transmogrification. If you hear of criticisms from people about money being "wasted" on sporting clubs, put the whingers straight.

Up-graded practice facilities are part of the changes to be made. What we don't have yet is a timeline for these improvements, but we are working closely with the council on this

In the meantime, our club offers its congratulations and thanks to the Councillors, council staff and consultants for their efforts so far. While off-field progress is always terrific, we are mindful that what we do on the field ultimately defines us.

We believe that we are working as quickly as possible towards the goals of club championship successes.

We can say that with confidence because of a number of enduring images from the first half of the season include youngsters Lewis and Eastman guiding the 2nds home in front of the balcony, of the next generation of Chisholms making a turf debut, of great stories from all grades of youngsters proving themselves at the next level.

For club and country

While there appears to have been a Newtown club playing cricket in the 19th century, we have to wait until the early 20th century to find an official starting date from which to throw forward to a centenary.

The summer of 2010/2011 will be that moment, and much is already being planned, including the writing and publication of a new club history. This will draw heavily on the wonderful work already done by David Barnes. What an ornament and amazing asset this bloke is to our club.

Part of researching that book has already thrown up a poignant story about another bloke who qualifies as an ornament of our club. His name is Adrian Ambrose Connor.

Never heard of him? That's a shame because his story is a wonderfully inspirational one. He was the first secretary. He wasn't the best of cricketers. Barnso's research has revealed his figures for our club:

23 innings
5 not outs
18 highest score
70 aggregate runs at 3.89!
Including 8 ducks in his 23 innings!
Best bowling 0/13.

However, his contribution to what we have today far outweighs those meagre stats, or three years of taking the minutes. He made, to use the cliché, the ultimate sacrifice for his club and country.

Adrian Connor was killed at the Battle of Fromelles in the First World War. Even sadder, two of his brothers also died in the Great War. Imagine if you can what their parents went through. Three times the telegram boy pedalled into Fairview Street, Newtown, with the most dreaded of news. Puts into context some of the issues we are dealing with at the moment.

Adrian Connor is buried in an Australian war cemetery in Calais, France, a long, long way from Newtown. The distance in kilometres and years though should not get in the way of us remembering him.

It is the intention of the club, as part of the centenary processes, to ensure that we do more to honour the memory of the club's fine array of administrators, the people who through personal sacrifices - none as great as A.A. Connor's thankfully - have contributed to what we have today.
