Rocket tail ender blasts into space

BRILLIANT late-order hitting from fast bowler Jai Sheahan on Wednesday guided the Barwon Rockets into the Dowling Shield under 16 quarter-finals.

Sheahan plundered 50 not out from 36 deliveries to lift the Rockets under-16s from the depths of despair in their pursuit of the Western Waves' 152 at Geelong Cricket Ground yesterday.

The Rockets had slumped to 9-123 in their chase when number 11 Jamie Harrison joined Sheahan in the middle.

Harrison made five not out, as the pair added 45 to steer the Rockets past their victory target and then reach the close at 9-168.

Top-order batsman Jack Wood also made 51, while Meyrick Buchanan added 20 before a dramatic collapse all but erased any hopes of victory.

Earlier, Harrison did the damage with the ball, snaring 2-15 from seven overs. He was well supported by medium pacer Scott Condy (2-24) and leg-spinner Dane McFarlane (2-14).

The tight victory secured the Rockets a quarter-final berth after other results went their way.
