Geelong Cricket Association official resigns over rescheduling saga

GEELONG Cricket Association sponsorship and promotions officer Scott Mullen has resigned in a bitter postscript to last week's decision to abandon four round one matches.

Mullen yesterday quit his post after fellow GCA management committee members decided against rescheduling games that were cancelled because of unsuitable turf wickets.

Management met on Tuesday night to revisit the issue.

However, they came to the same conclusion that the fixtures would not be rescheduled and that all clubs involved would be awarded three points each.

A furious Mullen said the issue was a deal breaker for him after three years at management level.

"The final straw for me was they refused to change the decision because they would 'look stupid'," Mullen said.

"I have genuine concerns about the ongoing future of cricket in Geelong if those type of decisions continue.

"The decision to call off games seems to be becoming more and more frequent and it's my point of view that as custodians of the game we should be trying to play more cricket, not less.

"Whilst I have seen that go on in the past and reluctantly been prepared to accept it to maintain an image of harmony within management, I can no longer do that and that's why I have resigned."

GCA president Grant Dew said he was sad to see Mullen go but stood by the association's decision.

"It is disappointing but Scott's been a member of management for the last few seasons and been a good contributor, so I'm sad to see him go," Dew said.

"We made a decision in good faith at the time, to the best of our ability and it's not a massive issue to be honest. It's been dealt with in a manner that we try to deal with most issues.

"Again, it's everyone's right to feel strongly about an issue but that's his decision."

Mullen said he was opposed to orders that prevented matches from going ahead.

"The bigger picture is that moving forward, Bellarine Football League is

keen to stage finals at Queens Park and there is every chance Newtown will have to cop a draw in round one every year because a wicket cannot be prepared," he said.

"It's not a matter of wearing my club hat. Let's face reality. Grovedale was runner-up and we finished second last, so ... we have three points that we may not have had, but guys have missed out on a game."
