GEELONG CRUSHES SUNBURY

The Geelong Over 60's cricket team maintained its unbeaten start to the season with a crushing win over Sunbury at Stinton Oval on Sunday.

GCA veterans Robert Agg and debutant Ian Foot both scored neat 40 as the Cats reached 152 from their 40 overs.

Other contributors with the bat were skipper Bernie Clancy who made 31 not out and Lindsay "Paul Sheahan" Fisher, who was unbeaten on 15.

Sunbury managed to bat out its 40 overs but could only muster 8-74 as all the Geelong bowlers chipped in with wickets.

Agg got the early breakthrough then two lightning stumpings by Foot yielded wickets to Graham Lewis and Clancy, both bowling delicately flighted left arm wrist spin.

Clancy congratulated his team on an all-round effort.

"I think we really strangled the Sunbury batting," he said.

"Our players really batted well right down the order, and then we backed it up in the field."

Sunbury echoed the sentiments of Geelong's first opponent Casey-South Melbourne that Stinton Oval, immaculately prepared by Graeme Taylor is one of the best venues used for Over 60s cricket.

Certainly with two excellent wins and a home ground to be proud of Geelong has quickly made its mark in the Victorian Over 60's Cricket Association.

Geelong's next opponent however, will provide a stern test.
