FORMER footy stars Nigel Lappin and David Johnson were among a host of big names who took to the cricket pitch yesterday in the name of raising money for Lifeline.

The Hitting Depression for Six event was held at Queens Park and was organised by the Jason Clark Foundation and hosted by Billy Brownless.

Paparazzi kingpin Darryn Lyons, Bulldogs player Shaun Higgins and councillors Stretch Kentelj and Bruce Harwood fought it out in the celebrity challenge match.

Jason Clark Foundation chairman Andrew Green said he was very happy with the support and paid tribute to former Cats defender David Johnson, who was recently appointed development coach at the club.

"He's been instrumental in getting some of the guys to play in the match today, he's been fantastic," he said.

Mr Green said Johnson and his brother Mark had competed fiercely against each other, indulging in a bit of friendly sledging on the pitch.

"They're both pretty determined to win," he said.

Nightclub baron and celebrity snapper Lyons said depression was a big issue in Geelong and he was happy to support the event.

"There's been a great turnout and I'm really proud to be involved," he said.

"I haven't played cricket in 15 years. The bowling went OK but I'm not so sure how the batting will go."

He will return to London in a few weeks but admitted his team of photographers was working 24/7 to secure a clear snap of Tiger Woods.

"I'd say a photograph like that would be worth a million dollars or more," he said.
