A MESSAGE FROM BROWN ARMS

In September 1973 a single page written by our Chairman of Selectors, Paul Anderson, and signed on behalf of Secretary Ian Quarrel created the historic, rare and wonderfully successful publication called the True Blue Tribune.

Now it is turning 500, what an achievement and why did it happen and why is it successful?

In the 1972/3 season our first eleven at the Christmas break was sitting on top of the ladder in the 10-team competition. We then played two ties and a one run loss to miss the four yet again.

During the last match as we were losing, Paul Anderson our brilliant wicket keeper, took me, as Captain, for a walk around the ground and stated that things had to change in a big way. As a Club we were going nowhere.

He was prepared to become President and lead us maybe to the promised land, if you call seven first eleven premierships and many others throughout all levels of the revitalised Club, an acceptable outcome.

Communication was the key to the success and the True Blue Tribune was the catalyst.

Paul gathered a very strong off-field group around him, and things happened, including;

- Discos
- Pub raffles
- Melbourne Cup bonanzas
- little Tatts
- a huge new modern Club Rooms at no cost to the Club or members
- a new curator arrangement
- Black Ant reports
- Edwards pure English reviews
- Flaker v Elsie wrestling
- late night visits to the Chinese
- educating new young players at Percy Street
- fishing trips by plane
- car collisions with the bridge and other moving and parked vehicles
- an historic relationship with the then Newtown and Chilwell Council (we are still going, where are they despite the help they received from our school teachers Councillor Neville Crane and Councillor John Taylor?).



The True Blue Tribune reported "accurately "on all these momentous happenings.

Our Club has always had a strong representation of school teachers hence the emphasis on communication and a range of interesting activities.

In my time David Shaw became President taking over from Chemist Bert, then Brian Edwards from Flaker, then the revolution of Paul, then the prize recruit from Highton, Strop, then the scholastic Dale Pearce.

Spectacularly, the True Blue Tribune served and outlasted them all. Of course, many other school teachers performed and were regular contributors to the Tribune for one reason or another - George Schofield, John Taylor, Neville Crane, Scrivo, the Puppet Captain, Elsie, George Briggs, Graeme Taylor (at a different level), Greg Hansen, Michael Bowtell and our First Lady player and others.



Paul Anderson, through the True Blue Tribune, the outstanding administration and facilities and our teachers, was able to build a Club that players, their families, sponsors and friends wanted to join and be a part of and we had great access to juniors and hence success.

The only true misfit is David Barnes. Although well educated at the Diggers and finishing school at Percy St, he has travelled the journey and enabled us to still eagerly await each addition of the True Blue Tribune and sincere thanks and congratulations to all those who have kept this brilliant publication alive since the one pager of

In my role as Academy Director with Essex County Cricket Club 2005 - 2016 one of the key areas of development for our young scholars who were seen as potential professionals was too look at opportunities away from the structured environment of home and the academy where they would have to take personal responsibility over a period of time to develop, not only there cricketing skills, but as important to understand the life skills required to grow as a person.

Whilst reviewing this in the early years of my role with the academy I had a conversation with the our late President of Essex County Cricket Club, Doug Insole, who advised me he had recently meet an old friend called Warwick Hadfield in Australia and they had discussed young Essex players having a winter playing and coaching at his club Newtown and Chilwell Cricket Club and so the strong link that we see today between Essex and the Newtown and Chilwell club was established. Back home in England, the Tribune was a great way for us to keep track of how our boys were going.

On behalf of the club I would like to thank not only Warwick, but also Neville Crane, Frank Tuskes, Devon Royce and Phil Morgan who were instrumental in building and facilitating the relationship and making sure each young cricketer who came to the club was given every opportunity to learn and mature. I also thank Graham Gooch of Essex and England stature whose funding through his foundation has also been key to the overseas development of players.

Over time we have seen the benefits of our association in terms of those who gained or have professional contracts and perhaps with Daniel Lawrence who is in the England Lions squads to tour Australia we might soon see him in a England side which both clubs and its members would be very proud to see.


Cats at ease in run chase
