

# McKenna's all round magic beats Swans by Warwick Hadfield

A towering, unbeaten innings capped off a magnificent allround performance from club coach Paddy McKenna in the GCA Men's First XI game against South Barwon.

On day one, Paddy took four crucial wickets to ensure the Swans didn't get beyond what was an already imposing 9-337.

To beat that required something special. It came in the sweat-stained form of a 231-ball innings containing 16 fours and five sixers — 141 not out. Paddy is pictured above bringing up his century.

Dylan Hodge, the First XI captain, has always had the highest regard for Paddy.

"When he talks about cricket, people listen," he said.

People not only listened, but watched as Paddy first rebuffed the Swans attack after the loss of fellow opener Sam Mitchell for a duck, then combined in partnerships with Tyson Windus, Ronnie McKenna and Noah Guida to produce on the Two Blues best performance of the season.

As Bill Lawry attests elsewhere in this edition of the Tribune, if everyone pitches in, you can succeed in big run chases.

Tyson made 39 in an 88 runs partnership, then the Kks put on 157 before the lowercase k departed for 72

Enter Noah Guida, rapidly developing into an elite all-rounder in his own right, to help Paddy finish off the job, 60 not out, home by seven wickets, finals still a possibility.

**The Second XI** fell short in their run chase at KFC Oval, Jordan Tegelhuter, Jarad Battenally and Joshua Norman all getting into the 30s.

It was a nail-biter in the **Thirds**, with the skipper taking to WhatsApp in celebration of the draw that keeps his team in fourth place: "Yippee!"

Chasing 219, it came down to some broad-batted defiance from Adam Kalz and Mike Chapman to ensure the points were shared, the Two Blues nine-down.

**The Fourth XI** eviscerated South Barwon on day one, Aidan Grace

taking 5-7 from nine overs as he and his team-mates emulated the great Australian Test bowler, Arthur Mailey, 10-66 and all that.

Mailey took all 10 wickets for the touring Australians against Gloucestershire in 1921.

Humour has it that Mailey happily yielded a few runs to the Gloucestershire number 11 so as to get the figures that allowed him to pun on the fabled English history book 1066 And All That for his own memoir, 10 for 66 And All That which he published in 1958.

After such a conquering first day what happened on day two was not unexpected. Madden Sadowy first, then Jacob Harmon, and finally, The Tank, belting the ball to all bits of Shaw Oval.

Jacob's century puts him in elite company among juniors to score senior hundreds.

Stoker's innings earned him a smiling rebuke from his premiership captain of last season, Darren Fleet.

When Fleetie was out for 99 recently, he was taunted by Zac's "great half-century Darren".

So, it was no surprise that among the congratulations for Stoker's 93 was a message that read: "Good 50 Tank!!"

On the barren earth that is Belmont High, the president scored 85 for **the Fifth XI** which remains on top of the ladder. Acting skipper Adam Patching contributing 68 no and 3 wickets.

Four weeks to finals. Be there.

# In great company – Jacob Harmon joins an elite list of century-makers

Jacob Harmon is the 10<sup>th</sup> Two Blue junior to make a century playing senior cricket.

"He's among some mighty fine company," said keeper of the records, and the Two Blue flame, David Barnes.

Also in the top 10 are club secretary and life member, Russell Mitchell and Tim Clark, whose other claim to fame is to share a birthday with Bill Lawry - destined to be a century maker from birth.

Jacob bowled the final over, ensuring the match ended in a tie, thus securing a premiership for Anthony Devlin's team.

Against South Barwon, Jacob's canny bowling wasn't needed as the Swans lost 10 for 66, and all that.

On day two, Jacob scored 110, off 148 balls with 13 fours, an innings watched with great pride and admiration by the club's junior co-ordinator, Andrew Sadowy.

"I umpired the whole 70 overs having got out the week before," he chuckled.

"Jacob did a really good job; his concentration was incredible.

"It's awesome for him to be the 10<sup>th</sup> junior to score a century in senior cricket, great for his development.

"We've got a lot of talent in the juniors coming through.

"Even a 50 for these youngsters is fantastic as they learn the game, so a century is special."

# Two Blues' finals hopes stay alive after superb run chase by Wes Cusworth

Newtown & Chilwell's dream of finals has a pulse thanks to a brilliant undefeated 141 from opener Pat McKenna; the win elevating the Two Blues to within six points of the top bracket as five sides scramble for positions three and four on the GCA1 ladder.

The 231-ball masterclass was the second time McKenna has carried his bat to victory with the first – an undefeated 115 - coming in the Round 6 defeat of Grovedale.

"It was pretty unbelievable to watch, to be honest, he's that stubborn that he just hates losing, he'll do anything to win," elated Two Blues skipper Dylan Hodge said post-game.

"Sometimes that means he's got to bat for the day and work through whatever fatigue, heat, dehydration or whatever he's got; he'll just do it to get a result."

# Two Blues' finals hopes stay alive after superb run chase

## **Day 1:**

South Barwon has strengthened its claim for a top-four finish after an accomplished 84 from emerging star Bryson Nicholls anchored the Swans' imposing 9-337 against Newtown and Chilwell at Reynolds Oval.

The elegant Nicholls struck 12 boundaries in his 188-ball contribution providing the platform for the home side's latter order to again cash in with a period of lusty hitting.

Nicholls' landmark innings came after some early concern for the Swans as they slipped to 3-52 with attacking trio Leigh Lorenzen (27), Mat Dawson (10) and skipper Nick Butters (four) back in the pavilion.

That preceded a crucial 111-run, fourth-wicket stand between Nicholls and fellow young gun Nat Pearson (46).

"It was similar to last game against Grovedale, where it was just about me anchoring the innings," an elated Nicholls said at the day's end.

"It was good batting with Nat, it was pleasing to see him get a few runs this week after missing the last couple of games."

In weathering the storm, Nicholls paid tribute to the pressure applied by the Two Blues attack.

"Jorden Lewis bowled well with 'Hodgey' (Dylan Hodge) up around the top of the order, while Archie Bain and Noah Guida were good for them through the middle period," Nicholls said.

"I thought even Sam Allen's leg spin was quite handy as well."

While Pat McKenna was the Two Blues' best rewarded bowler with 4-62 from 13 overs, several of the visitors were met head-on by some challenging late-order aggression led by Jasper George's 49-ball 54 and 59 from 73 balls from Andrew Ross.

The pair added 104 for the seventh wicket in just 17 overs.

"Batting those middle overs allowed those guys to come in at the end and whack the ball a bit." Nicholls said.

"They've really enjoyed coming in with about 20 overs left and having the licence to go for it, so it was really good to see them bat well."

#### **Day 2:**

Despite the early loss of Sam Mitchell, McKenna teamed with Tyson Windus (39) for a vital 88-run stand, before joining forces with English-raised namesake Ronnie McKenna (72) in a brilliant 157-run partnership for the third wicket.

South Barwon may have felt in the game when skipper Nick Butters (1-64) removed Ronnie McKenna with 88 still required, although that hope was swiftly quashed with a ballistic cameo

while Archie Bain and Noah from 19-year-old all-rounder Guida were good for them Noah Guida.

Guida pounced on any available width or length in hammering three sixes and seven fours that saw him dominate the unbroken fourth wicket stand with Pat McKenna with a 48-ball 60.

"I've said before that we have guys like Noah and Archie Bain, who can genuinely bat, but being bowlers, have probably batted lower than where they probably could have in the past," Hodge said.

"So that's where we decided to give Noah a go up at five, and he did it against the old ball, he scored against spin, he scored against pace, they brought the new ball out and he basically finished the game."

Along with his on-field heroics, Hodge credits Pat McKenna with instilling belief in the Two Blues pre-game as they prepared to pursue South Barwon's daunting 337.

"Pat encouraged our guys not to think about the scoreboard, but just to have the objective to bat 80 overs," Hodge said. "We agreed that we'd decide after 60 to 65 overs as to whether we we're going to bat for the draw or go for the win, depending on how many runs we needed and how many wickets were down.

"A score like 340 can be daunting, so we just reminded our batsmen to take their mind off the scoreboard and just do it in 20-run blocks; get to 20, tick it off, then get to the next 20."

The success leaves Newtown & Chilwell in contention with games against Lara and Highton to come.

"It's all very tight between third and eighth and they're two sides that we're neck and neck with," Hodge said.

"Some other results and different things need to happen, but if we win those two games, I think we're definitely going to be around the mark."

# "You get half the runs and I'll get the rest."

As Victoria's finest, William Morris Lawry, celebrates his 87<sup>th</sup> birthday (Greg Wells would advise him to avoid that number) the Tribune looks back on one of his greatest innings – from a club game played over four days from April 2<sup>nd</sup> to April 16<sup>th</sup>, 1966

The quote above might also be attributed to Paddy McKenna as he walked out to bat to begin his towering knock against South Barwon the day before Lawry's birthday.

Lawry's enduring quotable came as he opened the batting for Northcote in the VCA grand final after Essendon had declared at 9-514.

"When we went out to bat, I said, 'we've taken a long time to get here, if I get half you can get the other half'," Lawry said.

"It was a throwaway line, nobody expected to make 514. After the end of the second day, at 0-100 ... we felt then that we had a rough chance.

"But they were a top side, they were on top all year, they had a good attack, they were a good fielding side ... they had some big names."

So too did Northcote, the stoic left-hander who had already monstered England on an Ashes tour.

Beating Essendon required another monster performance. Lawry's 282 did the job with a bit of hand from his team-mates.

His opening partner Wayne Robinson, dropped early, helped put on 130 for the first wicket.

Tom Ryan shared in a 191-run stand for the fourth wickets and Frank Brew, the last wicket to fall, scored 47.

After 122.1 overs, the mountain had been climbed

"It had never been done before and I don't really think we thought we were going to make it," Lawry said.

"It kept going for days and days, about a four or five Saturday final.

"For us it was very important because we hadn't been in a final since about 1913.

Most of us had been brought up there. "I went to Northcote when I was 11 and hadn't played in a finals series. We were very keen to do well, but as it turned out, it was a memorable final for all of us.

"It was a big occasion for all of us ... the underdogs to come up and win a flag was great."

Lawry batted for eight hours and 29 minutes, faced 454 balls, and would have passed Bill Ponsford's record of 295 if Northcote had not passed Essendon's innings.

Typically, he brushed aside all praise, declaring the win a team-effort.

"Essendon had a big score of 514, but Northcote showed what could be done when you all pitch in and make a few," he told *The Age*.

Lawry had made more than a few that summer. In between his first-class and Test

duties, he finished the season with 714 runs at 119 from seven matches. The next best was 678 by Eric Shade of Prahran, who played 13 matches. Ian Redpath, with 71.67, was the only other batsman close to Lawry's average.

In 2000, the VCA Umpires voted the 1965/66 grand final the District Match of the Century.

Lawry, as generations of cricket lovers remember with a smile, went on to become an incomparable part of the Channel 9 commentary team and also Australia's most famous pigeon fancier, appointed as patron of the Australia National Racing Pigeon Board.

Happy 87th birthday, Bill Lawry.

Playing in the 1965/66 grand final was the Two Blues own Mike Mitton who took two wickets for Northcote, 17 year old Paul Shanahan (father of Damien) and champion Essendon footballer Barry Davis brother of N&CCC legend Ken.

However, while his teammates have left their kit in India and will not be doing "a whole lot of training", according to head coach Brendon McCullum, Lawrence will be available to feature in Desert Vipers' final two ILT20 group matches.

Desert Vipers currently sit fifth in the table, two points outside the playoff places.

Lawrence, selected as a wildcard signing by the Vipers, was in the UAE for the second edition of the franchise tournament when he was called up to England's Test squad as a replacement for Harry Brook, who was returning home for personal reasons.

Before his departure, the 26-year-old did feature in Vipers' season opener, scoring 19 runs and taking 1 for 12 in a six-wicket defeat against Abu Dhabi Knight Riders. He is yet to play in the Test series.

Desert Vipers' director of cricket, Tom Moody, said: "We are delighted to welcome Dan back to the Vipers and it is something that makes perfect sense for everyone.

"The Vipers are getting a top-class player, someone who can affect the game with bat and ball who has already been part of the Vipers set-up. For his part, Dan is getting the opportunity for some time in the middle and, when he returns to the England fold, they will have a player who will have benefited from playing."

#### 'Overpromised, under-delivered fiasco': The scoring system driving club cricketers mad

Overpromised and under-delivered. Prone to glitches. A step backwards. Not fit for purpose. A drain on resources.

These are some of the criticisms levelled at PlayHQ – the online scoring and registration system introduced by Cricket Australia for grassroots clubs and cricketers.

PlayHQ has in the past two years replaced MyCricket as CA's online platform for registrations, live results, fixtures and fees.

Caleb Cluff, secretary of Maryborough and District Cricket Association in central Victoria and the president of the Carisbrook Cricket Club within that association, has played cricket for more than 50 years.

"It has been a disaster for small associations in the cricket world," Cluff said in an email. "It requires a dedicated person from each club to learn and use; it's prone to glitching; it's slow and unwieldy – but worst of all, it's an attempt to shoehorn a game reliant on statistics into a basketball html [online format] frame."

Respected cricket writer Gideon Haigh, who is also a veteran player in Melbourne's Mercantile Cricket Association, was similarly scathing.

"PlayHQ is a massive step backwards in functionality and usefulness. It's a joke, an over-promised, under-delivered fiasco, money poured down the drain that has set club cricket back years," he said.

Initially billed as a "one-stop shop" for community sport, the company secured contracts with Melbourne-based sports: the AFL, Basketball Victoria, Netball Australia and Cricket Australia. Three other state basketball bodies have since joined, as well as four state netball associations, with hockey and cricket in New Zealand also signing on.

In club cricket, it is common practice for one team's scorer to complete the scorebook in the traditional way, while the other records the stats in PlayHQ using an iPad. The scores can then be viewed in real time by, say, parents who follow a particular club or players using a mobile phone app. A user must later ensure the app and the scorebook are consistent.

This was also the case with MyCricket, but club administrators who have used PlayHQ this season in Victoria and for two years in NSW claim the new system places an additional burden on the thousands of volunteers who are the lifeblood of club cricket.

"Cricket uses a manual scorebook for a particular reason. Like Sanskrit, a good scorer can interpret the book (if it's well kept) into a marvel of statistics about performance and how a match transpires," Cluff said. "PlayHQ announced itself as relieving clubs of all that work, but instead it has imperilled over a century of statistical knowledge. We now employ a scorer to maintain our books as well as having to use another person to update PlayHQ."

In NSW, Finley Cricket Club committee member Matthew Whitty, who is also secretary of Murray Valley Cricket Umpires Association, said his club was also struggling with the new system.

"The system can't handle fill-in players. They appear as an asterisk. Bush clubs are struggling for numbers and we have to recruit fill-ins, and it shows them as so many asterisks. It looks very untidy.

"It is also very slow to recognise data. If you type in two numbers and it doesn't react, you retype the numbers and then four numbers appear instead of the original two."

This can create a situation in which runs are attributed to an asterisk, which can be recorded as scoring, say, 1111 runs instead of 11 or 111.

CA's executive general manager of community cricket and capability, James Allsopp, explained that, apart from privacy issues, asterisks are used for unregistered players. "We try to discourage fill-ins playing multiple weeks," he said. The issue of entering four digit scores, he said, was a lag problem which was "a very early season challenge and addressed well before Christmas".

Allsopp pointed out the previous system, MyCricket, had been operational fo<u>r 15 years. "Moving to a</u>

new system is a challenge for anyone, especially those who have been on the old platform for a long time."

According to PlayHQ chief executive Tim Mackinnon, the system now has two million registered participants, accessed by 77,000 administrators from 16,000 clubs.

Cricket Australia charges \$22.50 for each senior player registered and \$16 for juniors. Of this, 55 per cent goes towards club and player insurance premiums, 25 per cent is used to maintain and develop CA's digital Play Cricket products, and 20 per cent goes to PlayHQ as a platform charge.

"We're working hard to make it a really great platform. There's more we can do to make it even easier. There's always a challenge migrating to a new solution," Mackinnon said.

Whitty admitted there had been improvement. "Last year it was terrible but this year it's been marginally better."

When PlayHQ secured the contract with cricket, it was untested at a national level. Early criticism also focused on PlayHQ's ownership structure and the procurement process.

PlayHQ was 25 per cent-owned by digital consultancy Codeware. The AFL, Basketball Victoria and private investors owned the remaining 75 per cent. Codeware's share was bought towards the end of 2022 by Two Circles, a digital-focused sports agency that has since been sold to a global private equity company, Charterhouse Capital Partners.

PlayHQ's chair is James Sutherland, a former chief executive of CA and a director of AFL club, Geelong.
Sutherland left CA in 2018, well before he became chair of PlayHQ.

Cricket Australia insisted at the time that its procurement process that led to the selection of PlayHQ was comprehensive and transparent, denying its former CEO, Sutherland, had any involvement.

CA justified its decision to join the new digital company by claiming the previous platform, MyCricket, was outdated.

# A new work from Geelong's Gideon Haigh

Geelong's Gideon Haigh is Australia's premier cricket writer, until recently holding that privileged place with The Australian newspaper, but nowback operating as a freelancer.

As well as his magisterial newspaper writings, Gideon has published many books, and not just on cricket.

His latest cricket book is now available.

This is what it's all about, and how to purchase it, as told to Tribune readers by Gideon himself.

Australian cricketers don't come much more obscure than William 'Barlow' Carkeek, who played six **Tests** in 1912 as wicketkeeper. He wasn't even famous in his time. When first he was chosen for Australia, selector Clem Hill took the extraordinary step of publicly disassociating himself from the inclusion; a correspondent signing himself 'Old Hawkburnite' in The Argus defended Carkeek so:

"It is very evident that Mr Hill would let his personal feelings interfere with his judgment when selecting the best men, for he stated in reference to W. Carkeek's selection that, whatever Carkeek's merits as a player might be, he would offer the strongest possible objection to his being selected. Now any follower of cricket knows what Mr Hill is driving at. Can any of us afford to throw mud at a fellow cricketer who has been not so fortunate perhaps as we in being able to cover up successfully perhaps the only one indiscretion of his life."

'Anv follower of cricket knows'? 'The one discretion of his life'? I remember reading these lines, in those pre-Trove days, on a microfiche reader in the State Library of Victoria in 1999 and being too intrigued for words. One day, I thought, I'd go back and have a dig. It took two-dozen years, but the couple of months after the last Ashes tour proved perfect for the task: Trove, Ancestry, the Public Record Office. National Archives of Australia, the archives of Cricket Australia, the Victorian Cricket

Association, Prahran CC, Richmond FC and Essendon FC disgorged an extraordinary story of sport and social conditions. For Carkeek was not only a gifted player of all sports but a relative rarity in our annals: a genuine member of the urban proletariat, variously a grocer's assistant, a tramways worker, a riveter, a boilermaker and an instrument fitter.

That 'indiscretion'? This proved an underestimate: it turned out that Carkeek had decidedly rackety personal affairs. The One His Indiscretion of Life encompasses two suicides. two bankruptcies, two colourful divorce suits, cohabitation with a femme fatale to whom he was not married. marriage to another woman who brought to the relationship an illegitimate child, an assault charge and a violent accidental death. In the cricket culture war of 1912, Carkeek not only took the unpopular side of the Australian Board of Control for International Cricket, but courted its roughhouse displeasure by behaviour that was urgently hushed up. Less interesting men have played a hundred Tests. With cricket as his passport, Carkeek was able to visit the United the United States. Kinadom. Europe, Canada, Bermuda, Ceylon and Fiji. With cricket as his welfare provider, he enjoyed a better retirement than others depleted by working class toil.

I had the good fortune in my task to be assisted by Carkeek's grandson Brian Morris, family chronicler and memorabilia keeper. The result are some lovely mementos, handsome illustrations and much more detail than I could have accumulated twenty-four years ago. This latest title by the Archives Liberation Front has been been printed in China on lovely glossy art paper, wrapped in hard cover and dust jacket; many boxes of copies now repose in my kitchen, where they aren't doing me much good.
