

North retains Pearce-Hynes trophy despite Sam Mitchell 's heroics

A brave innings from Sam Mitchell, wasn't enough for the Two Blues to regain the prestigious Pearce-Hynes trophy from North Geelong. In other news The Second XI's unbeaten start to the season continued.

Sam Mitchell batted on one leg for much of his 59, his second successive half-century, after his knee buckled, forcing him to retire hurt.

Upon obtaining expert medical treatment, he returned with a runner.

Despite that innings, and a late effort from Noah Guida in pursuit of 227, North, which had its own late order contributors, won by 45 runs.

North's innings had been well-restricted until the late surge, the skipper bowling with his usual precision and purpose, taking 2-22

from his 10 overs, while Lachie Norton took his first First XI wicket.

The Second XI captain, Jordan Tegelhuter, with his team on the back foot, went to the old tried and tested take the pace off the ball, and it worked a treat, Jack Royce taking 3-42 with his "straight breaks".

"They were well on top and we were on the back foot at drinks," said Jordan Tegelhuter.

"Then Jackie Royce came on and stole the show with his right arm straight breaks.

"We just thought it would be a good idea to try a change of pace, their spinners had bowled well, and the pitch was giving nothing.

"Simmo (curator Ian Simpson) had prepared a road!"

The skipper was also full of praise for his Western District kinsman Bailey Young – they come the same club, Rup-Minyip.

"Bailey did a really good job at the end of their innings with his medium-pacers," Jordan said.

The Two Blues innings was built on the solid foundation of Darren Fleet's half-century. "The old fella hasn't lost it" his skipper said warmly.

"He also said it was a thrill to play on turf with Archie, and it was a win he will always remember.

"Tom Kiddle also batted well in partnership with Fleetie, and Doug Bergamin steadied us in the middle and Jack Royce played a really good innings for us, too."

The Third XI were beaten by North Geelong by four wickets, while the Fourth XI was unable to chase down North's 8-251 despite solid knocks from Mark Ainsworth and an almost run a ball 41 from Jack Hastie.

The Fifth XI flew the flag fiercely however, rattling up 7-241 with major contributions from Adam "When He Goes He Goes" Patching – five fours, four sixes – Max Inderberg and Anthony Lean, who whacked five sixers.

"It was his highest score for the club, and he was like a little kid," said Fifth XI captain Matt Sulvoltos.

"He hit one six over the road on the full at Windsor Park at North Geelong.

"Patch's inning was pure Patch.

"He had a new bat but he was nervous about using it, because every other time he used a new bat, he hit the first ball for six.

"So he took out his old bat and hit the first ball for six anyway!"

Playing in a howling wind, plenty of others showed the necessary grit.

"Max Inderberg batted very patiently, we batted around him, and he kept well and deserved the stumping he got," Matt said.

"It wasn't easy keeping in the wind.

"I gave Grant Meaney the worst job of bowling into the wind and he was fantastic with his two wickets.

"Henry Meaney fielded the house down and took a great catch, the only one of the day.

"It was hard catching in that wind.

"Zaiden Ainsworth bowled really well, the best I have seen him bowl, and he did a great job batting with Anthony at the finish, their running between the wickets getting us another 20 or so runs."

The skipper also pitched in with a wicket as he approaches a considerable double club milestone, 5000 runs and 300 wickets, but not as Captain Araldite.

He had to be talked into bowling, but sometime this summer, those well flighted — you wouldn't expect anything else from a pilot — legspinners might just get the next six wickets, coupled with the hundred or so runs that takes him to a rare altitude.



"As for Lauren, the scoreboard says it all, she is a very classy player," he said.


Twads was also full of praise for NCCC curator lan Simpson.

A critical 102-run eighth wicket stand between all-rounders Mitchell Troy (47) and Alistair McCann (44) was the key to North Geelong posting a winning score against Newtown and Chilwell at Keith Barclay Oval.

Impact opener Sam Hall launched the innings with an enterprising 33, although some tidy work by Dylan Hodge (2-22) and Joshua Norman (1-26) contributed to restricting the Magpies to an attainable 9-227on an uncharacteristically fast Osborne Park.
