Rolls-Royce Ronnie rolls one out

"Sooner or later Rolls-Royce Ronnie is going to produce," said the wise observer of all things First XI.

"He has got too much class for it not to happen."

And so, the prophecy was fulfilled.

Back on KFC, one of Ronnie McKenna's preferred grounds, the Country Ground at Chelmsford another of those, along with Chester Boughton Hall, the prophecy was fulfilled.

Not quite the century brought up with a six on to the Two Blues balcony that sent humans and wildlife scattering.

Or one of the 14 fours and five sixes in his 151 from 131 against the Lancashire Second XI last June.

But there were three of sixes, plus eight fours, all ferociously meshed into his 83 from 53 balls, a match turning, perhaps season turning, innings and with handy contributions from Paddy no relation, Tyson Windus, Tom Meredith and Chay Deary - more to come on him - the Two Blues reached 6-249, their best effort, so far, of the season.

At times, it might not have seemed enough, but tight lines from Dylan Hodge and Josh Norman allowed for some wicket-taking profligacy at the other end.

Then enter again, C. Deary, the skipper's clever choice as the sixth bowler: six and a bit overs of the tight stuff, 4-23, a spell to turn a match, perhaps even a season.

Paddy McKenna poled a couple before Chay took his final wicket, the Swans diving from 4-149 and in the chase to all out 212.

Unlike in earlier rounds, the results in the lower grades were not as decorous, but there was plenty to tantalise.

Jorden Lewis, 4-16 from 10, made a mess of the Swans top order, but they recovered to reach 191, 20 more than the Two Blues, despite

handy 30s from Jordan Tegelhuter and Lachie Norton.

The Third XI also lost a run chase, doing well to keep the Swans to 6-188 after they got off to a flying start, as Swans can do.

Sam Meaney (38) and Jarad Battenally (28) produced their own flyer, but in the end Rays of hope were snuffed out.

Former **Fourth XI** premiership captain Adam O'Connor and Barnaby Williams were the major contributors to their side's 8-170, a tally South Barwon chased down for the loss of just four wickets.

Mattie Sav's **Fifth XI** needed oxygen bottles in pursuit of the Swans' Everest-like 5-297.

Sherpa Patching did his best, while the skipper moved ever closer to the double of 300 wickets and 5000 runs, with his three wickets and 33 runs.

Only Bob Merriman, 5418 runs and 551 wickets, Devon Royce, 5790 runs and 319 wickets, and Greg Wells, 8025 runs and 727 wickets, have achieved this phenomenal mark.

Banjo Savage and Ben Harmon also made hefty contributions to the run chase, along with a stubborn 25 from the aptly named Adam Woollett!

FIRST XI defeated South Barwon on KFC Oval

Newtown and Chilwell's highly vaunted batting finally clicked into gear, enabling the Two Blues to claim their first scalp of the season with a 37-run defeat of South Barwon. Pat McKenna (44), Chay Deary (35), Tom Meredith (34) and Tyson Windus (32) all contributed with the willow, but it was an electrifying 53-ball 83 from Englishman Ronnie McKenna that ultimately propelled the Two Blues to an unassailable 6-249.

"It's massive relief for us as a leadership group and a club, we've never been in doubt about the talent we have here," coach Tom Meredith said about the win post-game. "We've just been really slow to start for a number of reasons and have put in four poor displays up until now.

"Ronnie is a genuinely quality batsman of County standard and even though he hasn't really shown that the first few games, there's a lot more to come from him."

The Combine's tally did look under threat for as long as Swans skipper Nick Butters was finding the boundary, striking six sixes and five fours in his punishing 68-ball 85.

"He's obviously a top draw batsman who could've taken the game away from us," Meredith said.

"But as soon as we got him out, we knew that we were a real chance."

While Dylan Hodge (1-18) captured the prized wicket of Butters, it was seamers Chay Deary (4-23) and Pat McKenna (2-19) who took the pace off the ball, swinging the game the way of the KFC Oval hosts.

"Every element from batting to bowling to fielding was top notch today, particularly the batting," Meredith said.

"We spoke during the week about having a clear plan in your head when you go into bat and I think everyone actually got in and contributed and played the role that we asked them to play.

"It was a great feeling in the rooms after the game, definitely a bit of relief for the lads."

Premiership anniversaries – Fourth XI 1963/64

Season 2023/24 sees the anniversary of several important events in the club's history, namely the premierships victories of the:

1st XI in 1973/74 ✓

1st XI in 1983/84 ✓

2nd XI in 2003/04 ✓

5th XI in 2003/04 ✓

4th XI in 1963/64 ✓

In this edition we take a look at the victorious Fourth XI premiership of 1963/64 which was the first premiership since the *Golden Era*, also the inaugural Fourth XI flag and the club's 10th.

The Fourth XI captained by Bob Merriman defeated Chanel College outright by an innings and two runs in the grand final. The match was dominated by Bob Merriman who took match figures of 10 for 85 including 7 for 50 in the first innings. *Brown Arms* was eligible to play in the 4ths under the District boundaries rule even though he resided outside Newtown's boundary.

"This match started the discussion of me going to Chanel, getting them and St Joseph's into District Cricket and ultimately doing away with District boundaries.", said Merriman.

Former champion Geelong VFL full forward Lindsay White made 128 in the grand final innings tally of 310 in 52 (eight ball) overs. He combined with son Lindsay Jnr – the first of 10 father/son combos to play in a premiership with the club.

Interestingly opening the batting for Chanel College students was a 14 year old Michael Bowtell.

Previously in the semi final the 4ths defeated Corio by a massive 280 runs scoring 6 for 361. Merriman scoring 103 whilst White Snr made 75 and A. Osborne took 6 for 19.

Merriman amassed 581 runs for the season at 52.81 and claimed 69 wickets at 9.84 to set a club record for the most wickets in a season. White Snr made 516 runs at 36.85.

The 4ths won 8 of 13 matches for the season after losing the grand final the previous season.

The Fourth XI went on to make it two flags in a row in 1964/65 under the captaincy of Russell Blackman.
